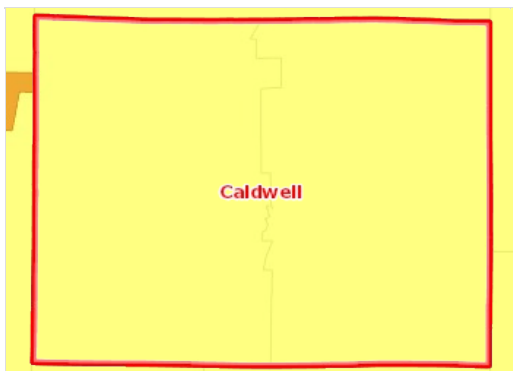

### Population, Density (Persons per Sq Mile) by Tract, ACS 2011-15

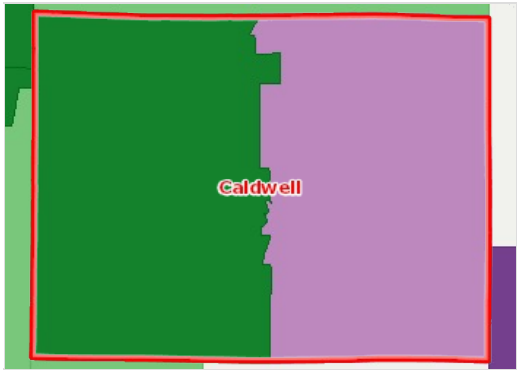

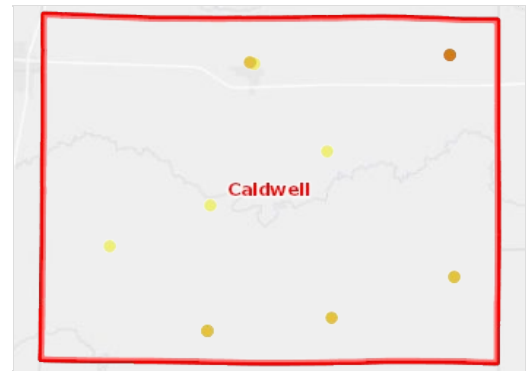

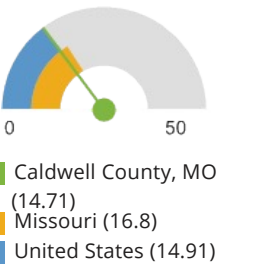

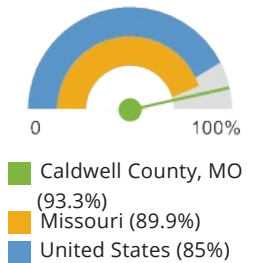

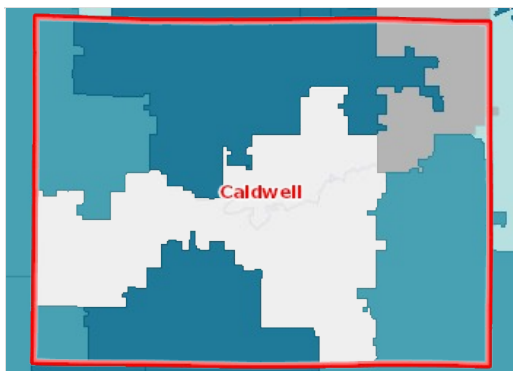
**Cohort Graduation Rate**

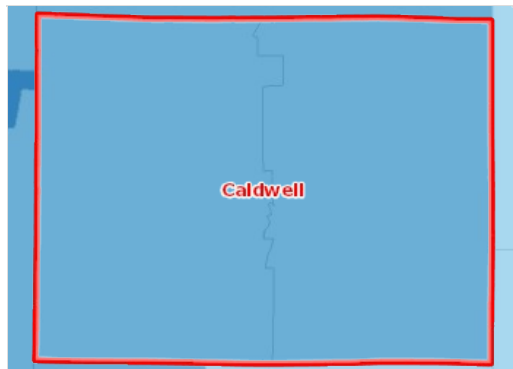

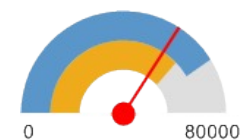

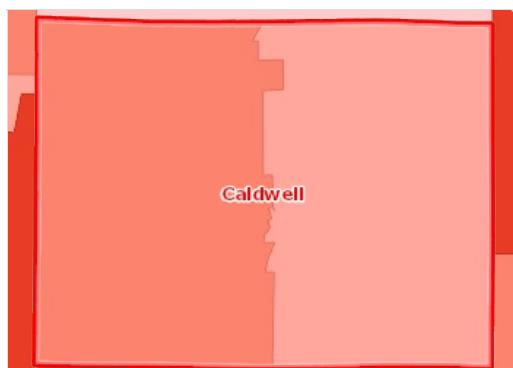

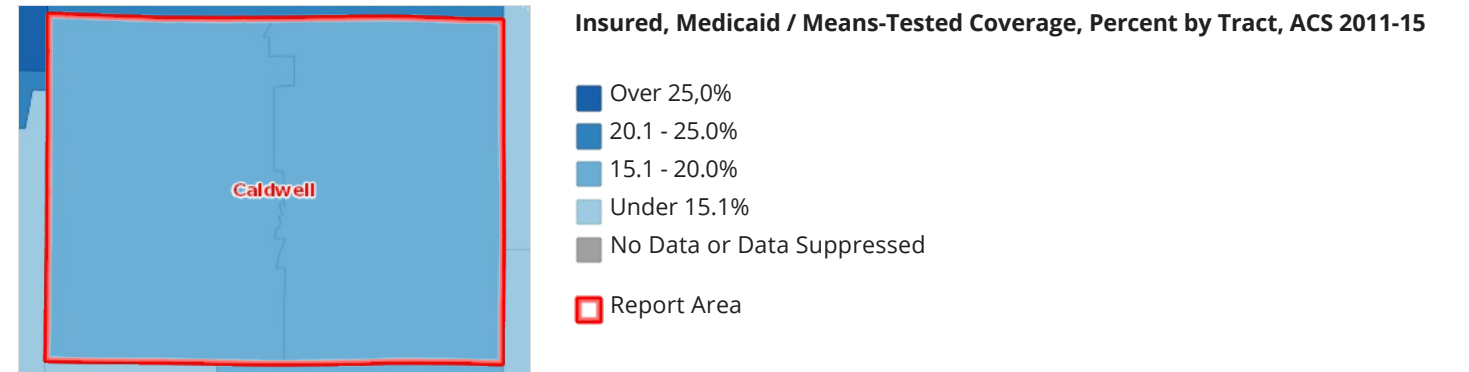
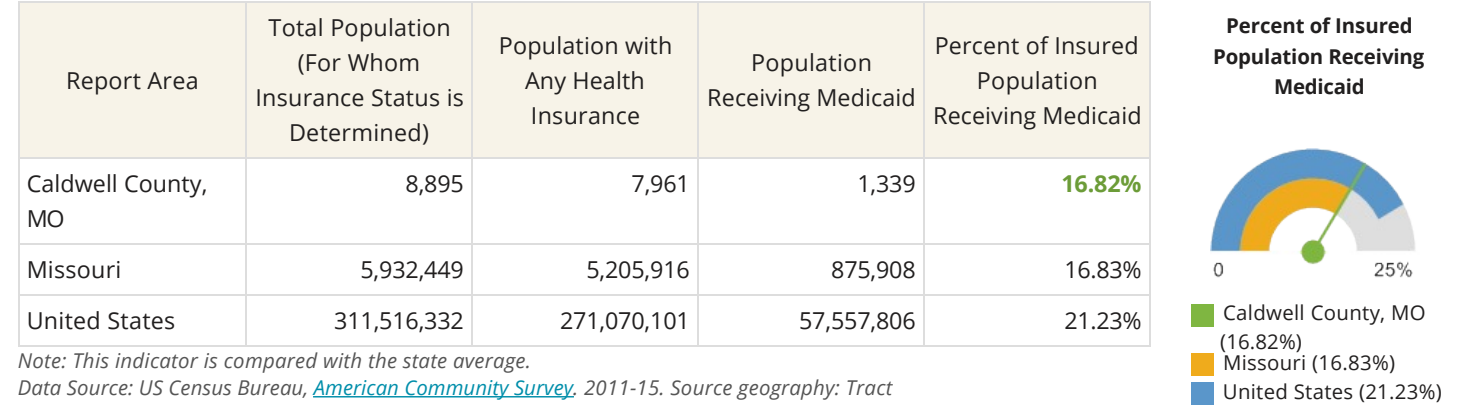


**Median Family Income by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

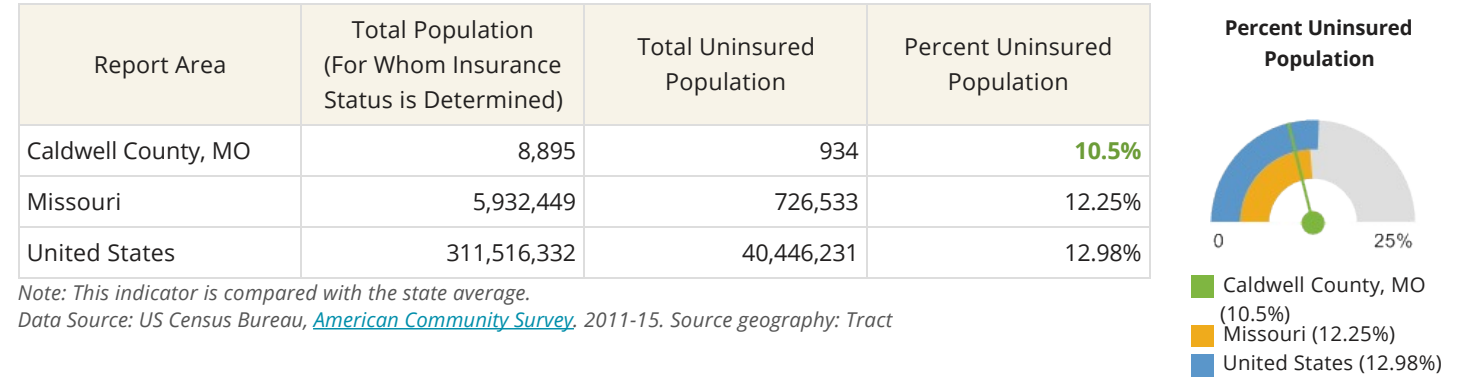

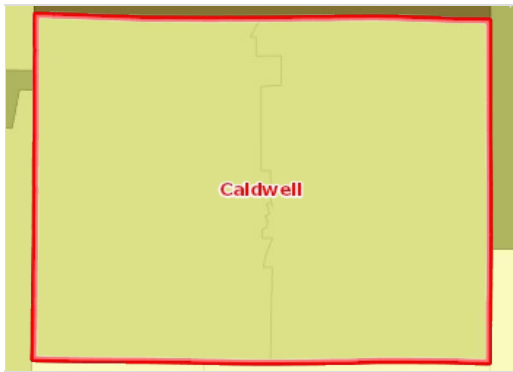

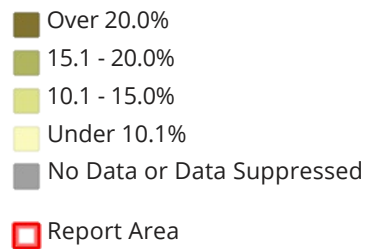

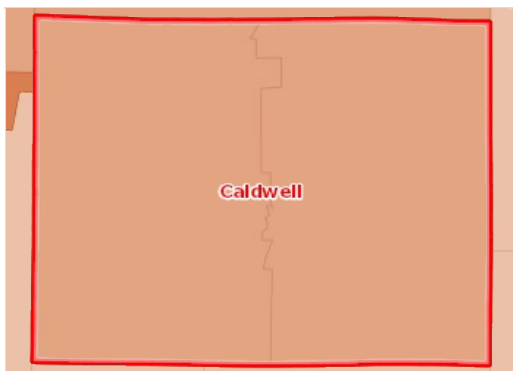

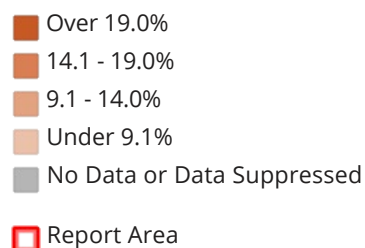

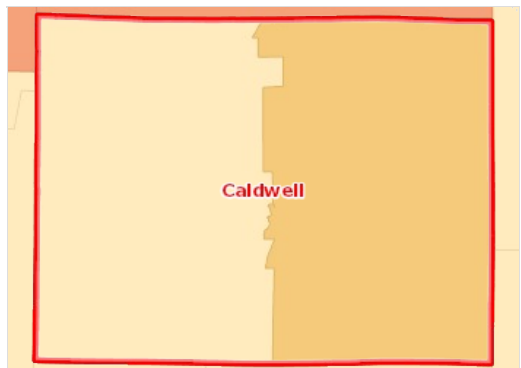

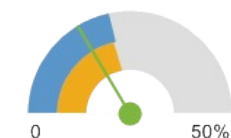

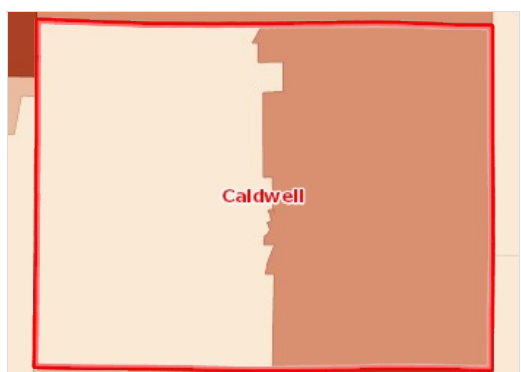

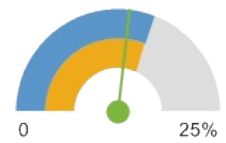

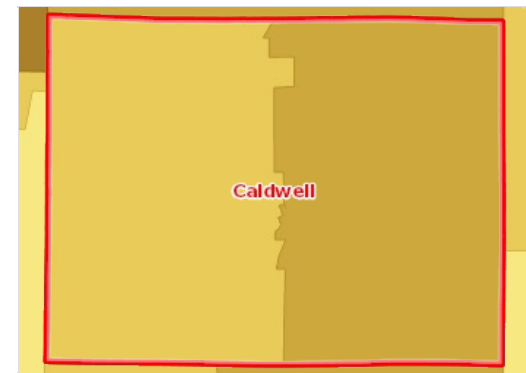

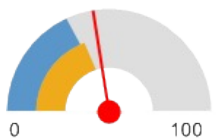

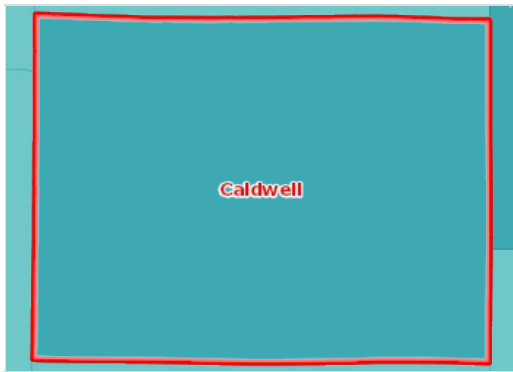

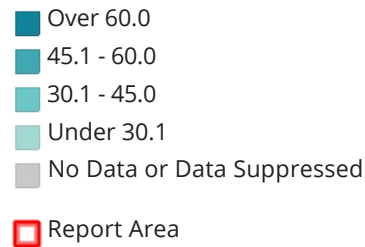
Teen Birth Rate (Per 1,000 Population)

**Births to Females Age 15-19, Rate (Per 1,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2006-12**

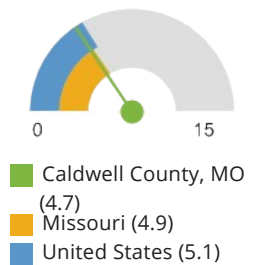

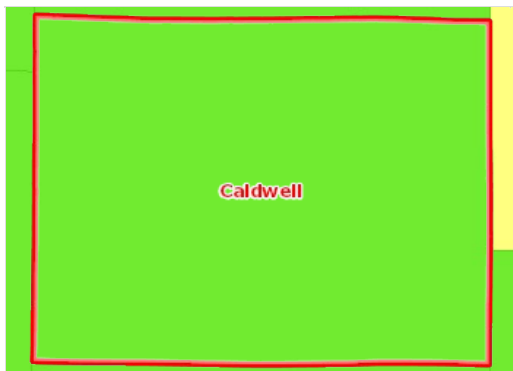

**Unemployment Rate**

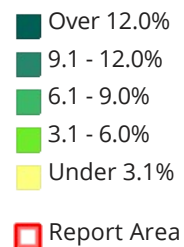

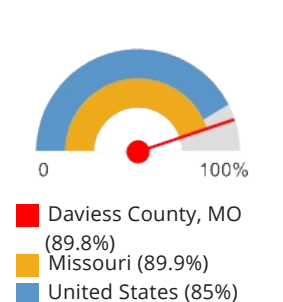

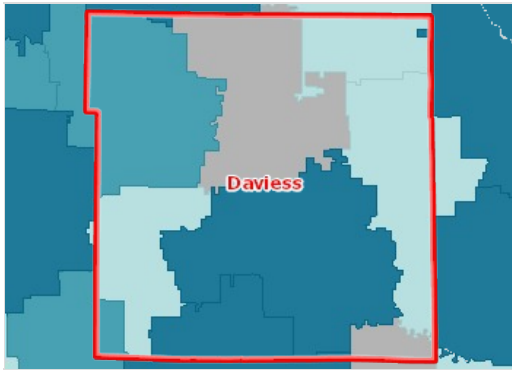

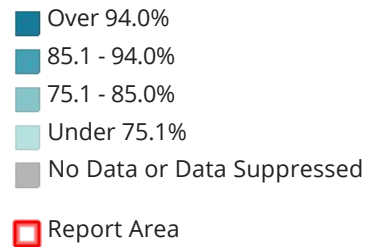

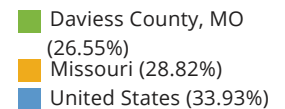

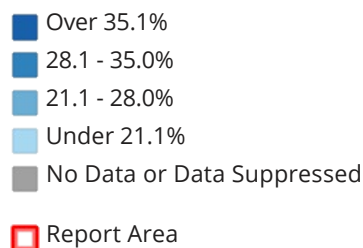

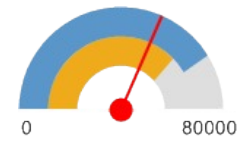

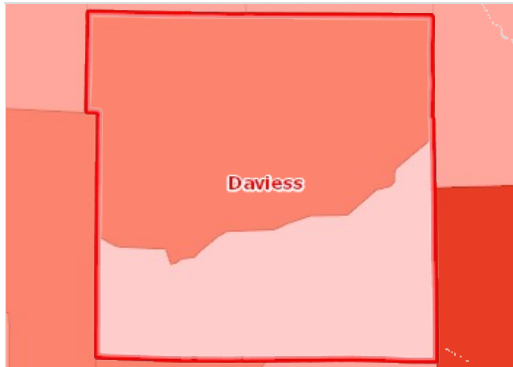

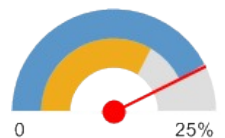

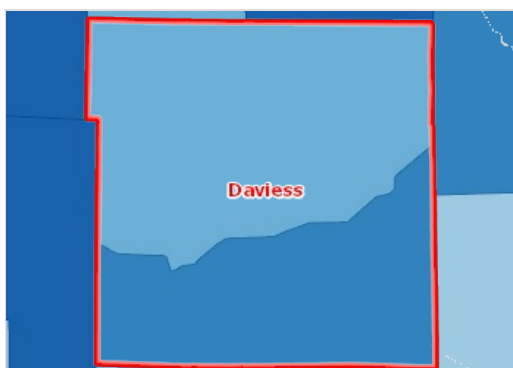

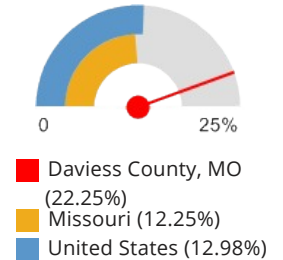

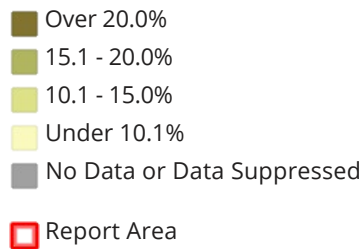

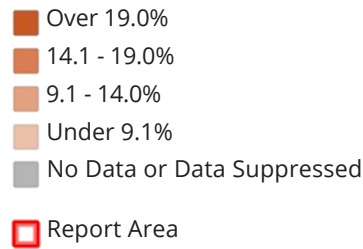

**Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

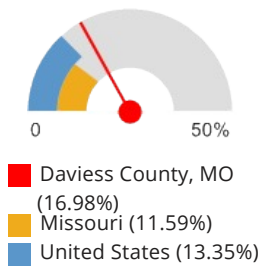

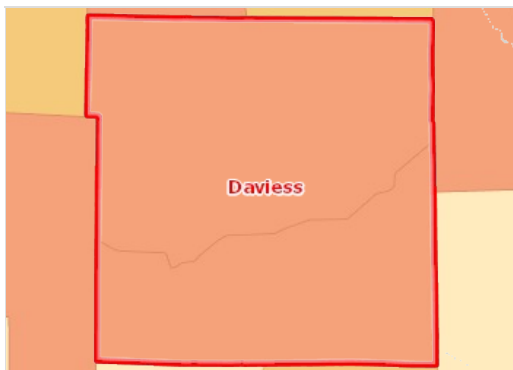

**Percent Population Age 25 with No High School Diploma**

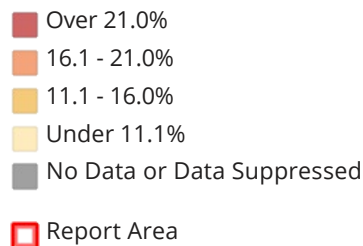

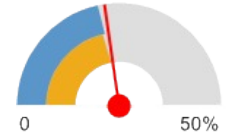

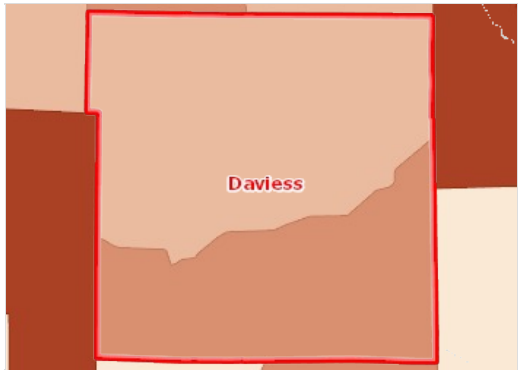

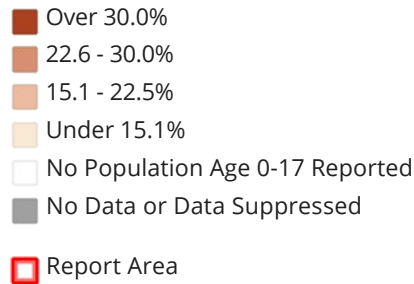
**Percent Population Under Age 18 in Poverty**

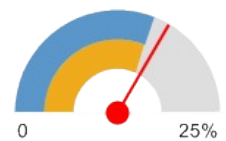

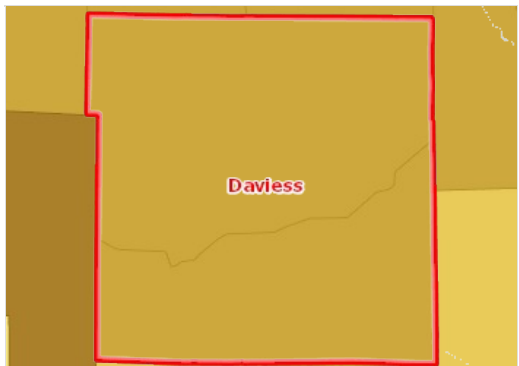

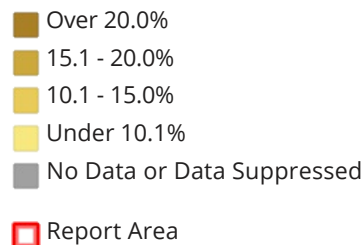
**Percent Population in Poverty**

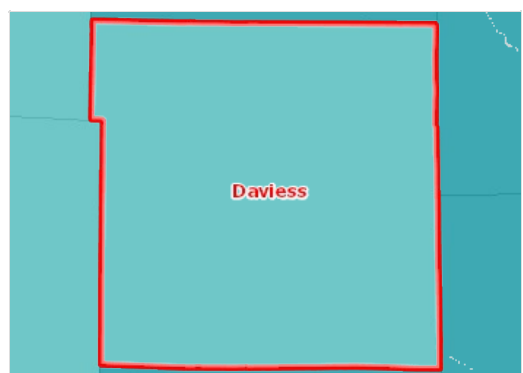

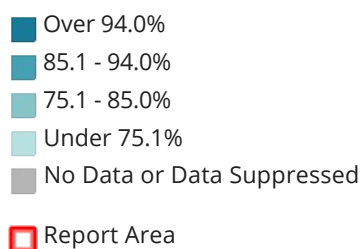

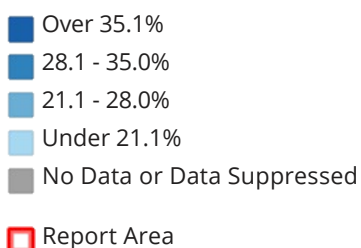

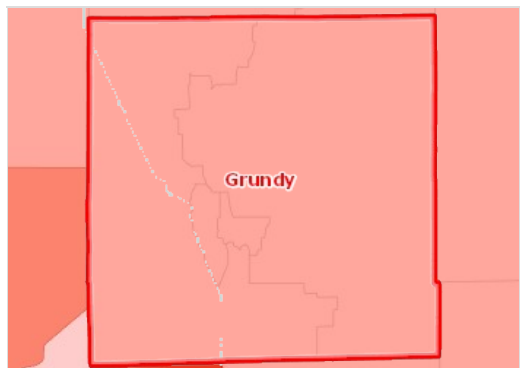

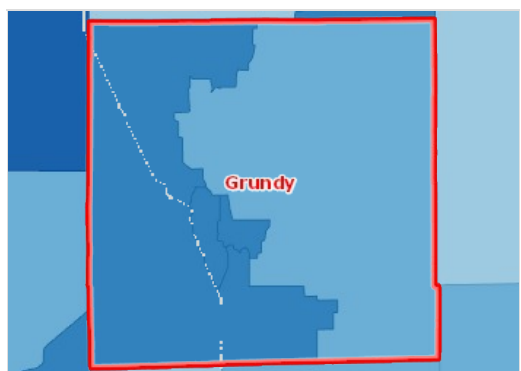

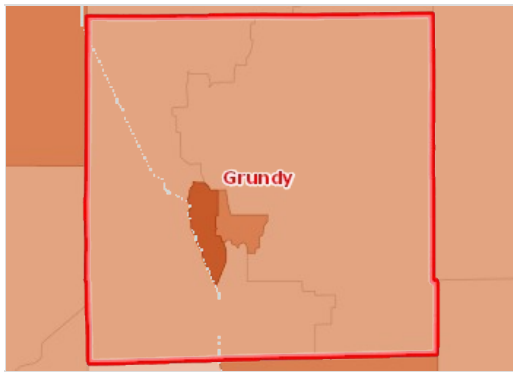

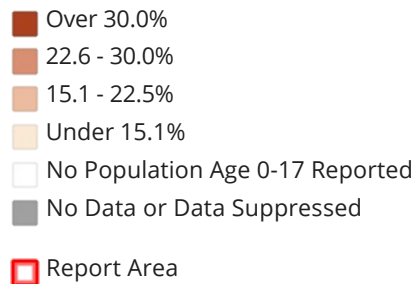

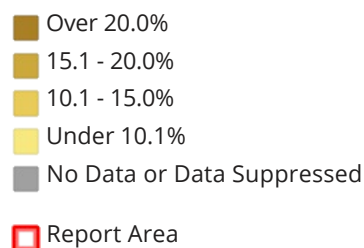

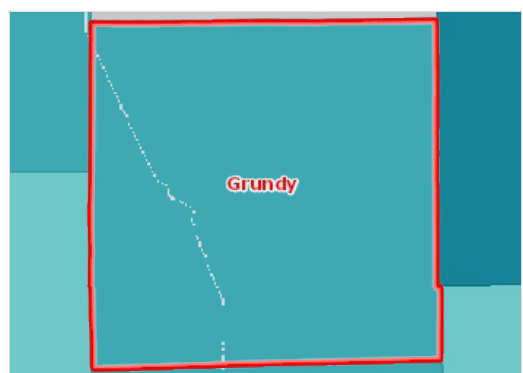

### Population, Density (Persons per Sq Mile) by Tract, ACS 2011-15

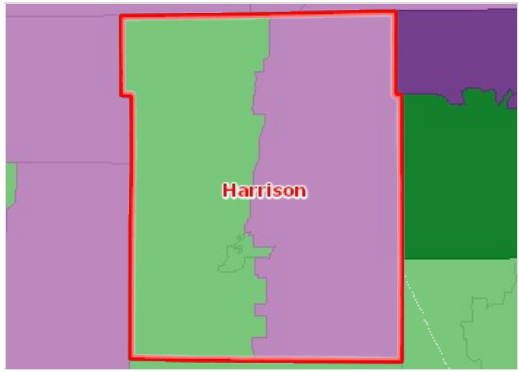

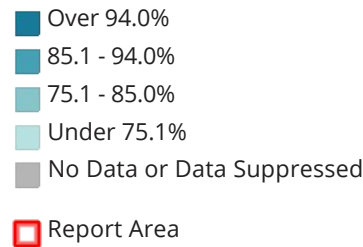

**On-Time Graduation, Rate by School District (Secondary), ED Facts 2014-15**

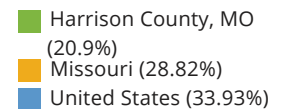

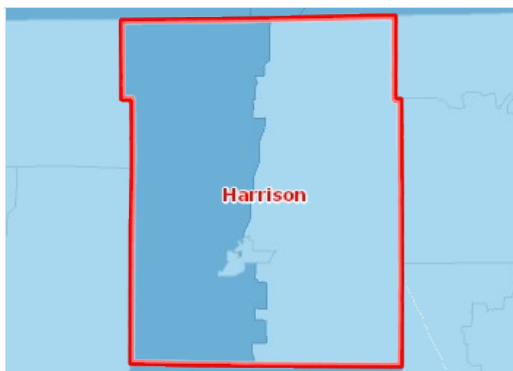

**Percentage of Households where Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Income**

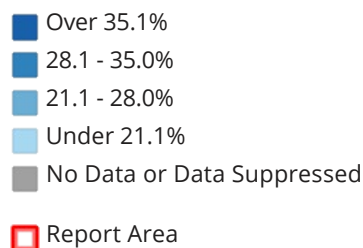

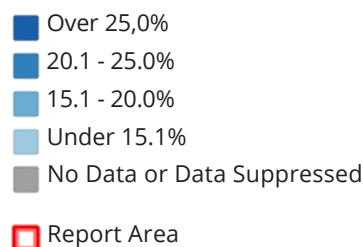

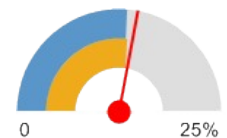

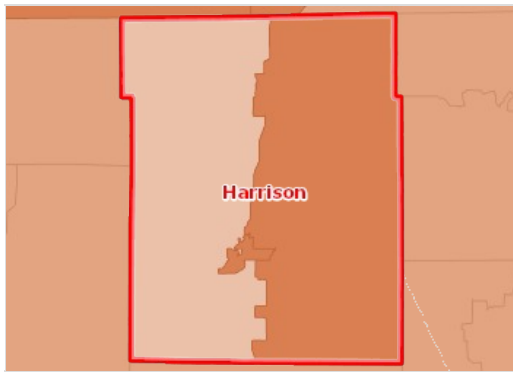

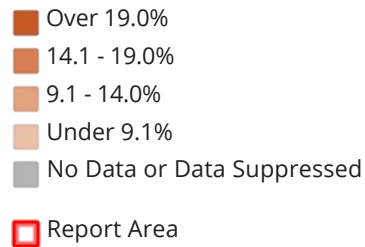
Percent Households Receiving SNAP Benefits

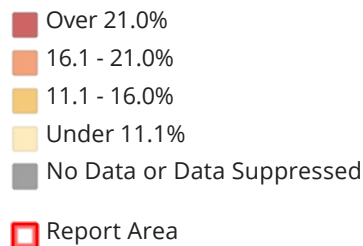

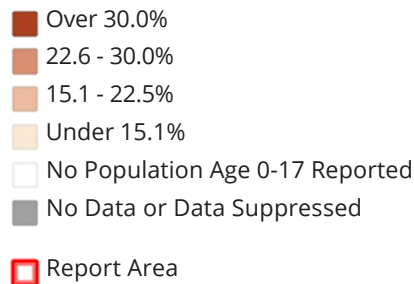

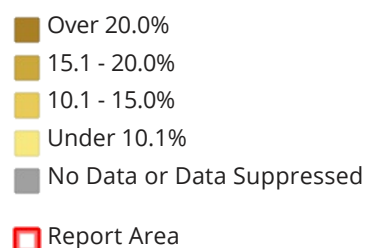

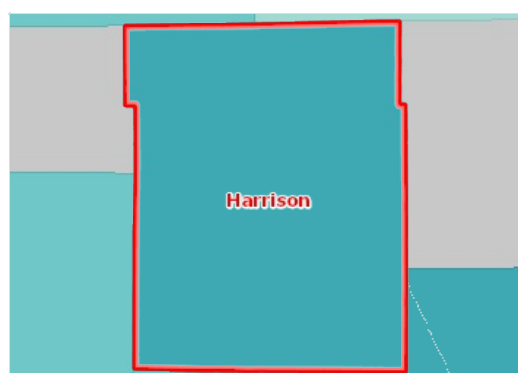

### Population, Density (Persons per Sq Mile) by Tract, ACS 2011-15

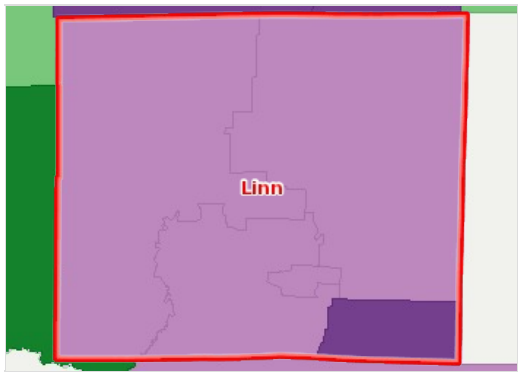

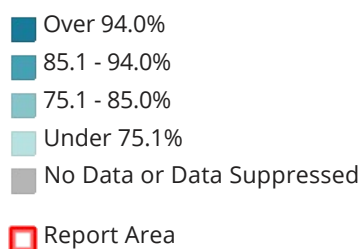

**On-Time Graduation, Rate by School District (Secondary), ED Facts 2014-15**

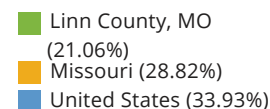

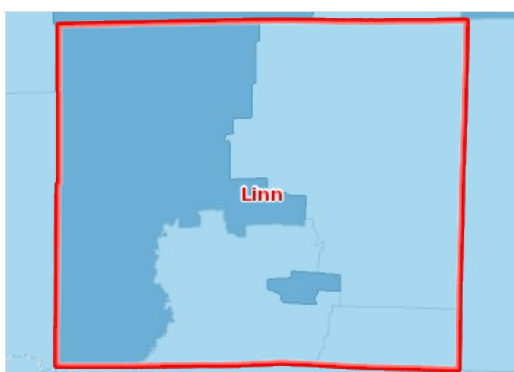

**Percentage of Households where Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Income**

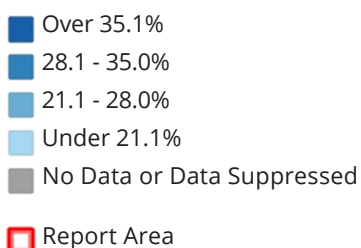

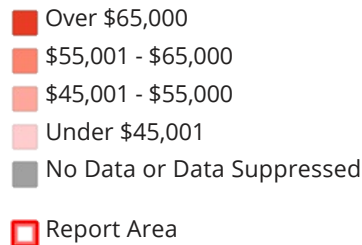

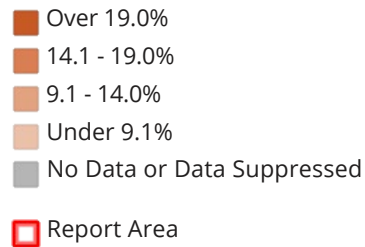
**Percent Households Receiving SNAP Benefits**

**Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

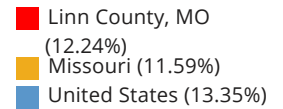

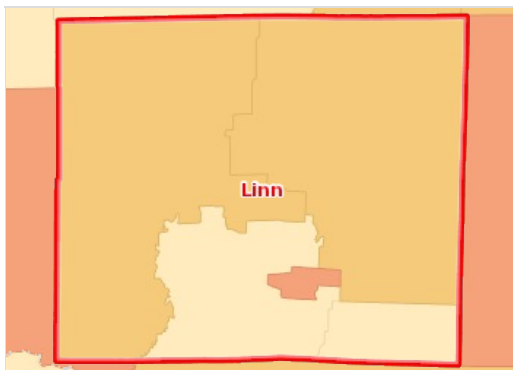

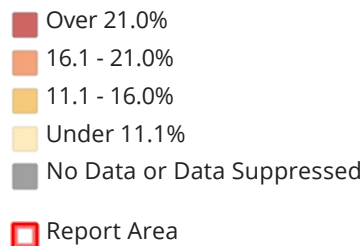

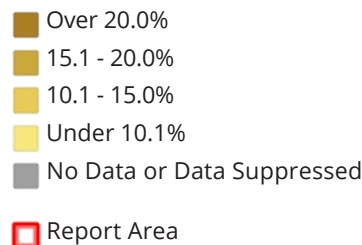

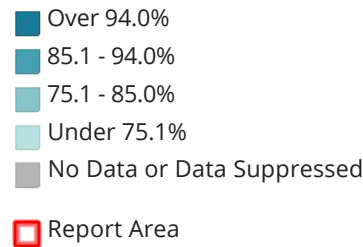

**On-Time Graduation, Rate by School District (Secondary), ED Facts 2014-15**

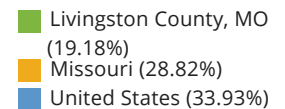
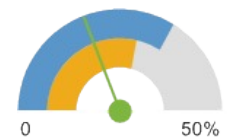

**Percentage of Households where Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Income**

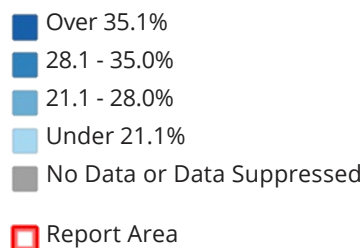

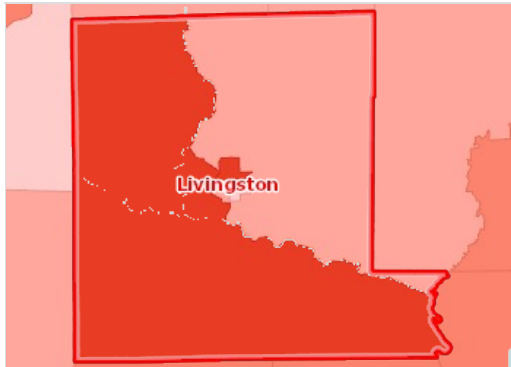

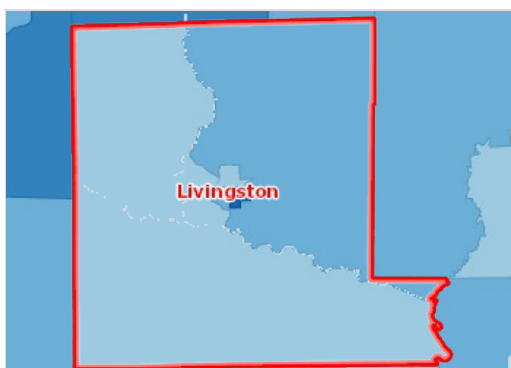

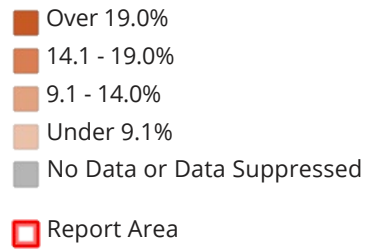

**Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

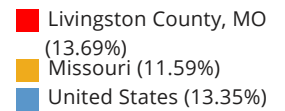

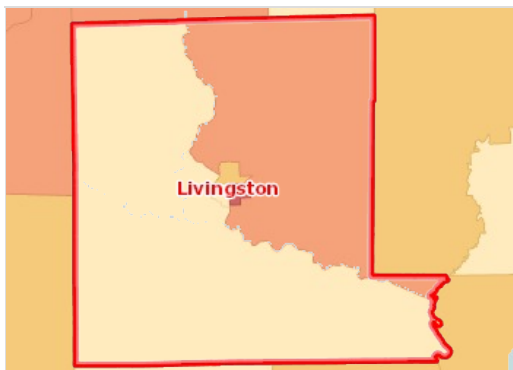

**Percent Population Age 25 with No High School Diploma**

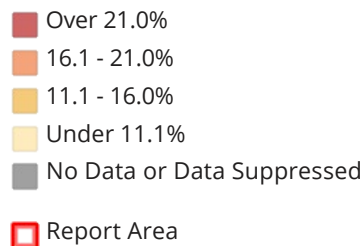

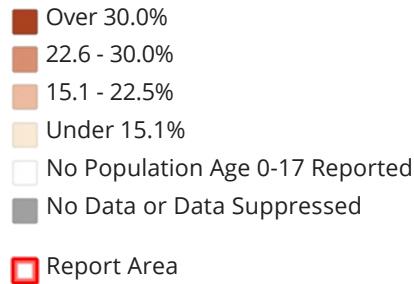

**Population Below the Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

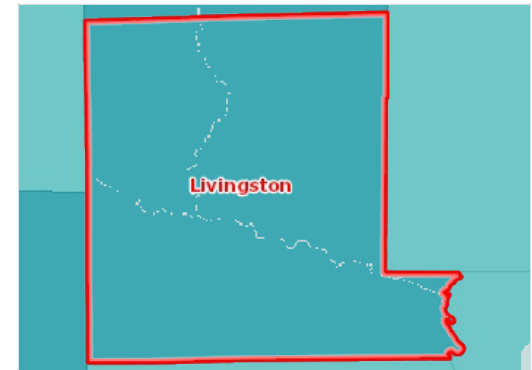
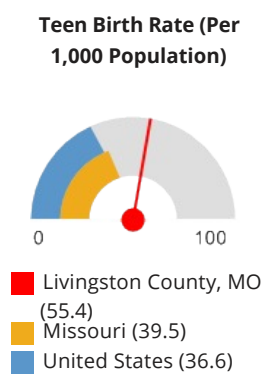

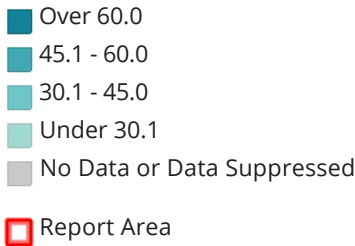

**Births to Females Age 15-19, Rate (Per 1,000 Pop.) by County, NVSS 2006-12**

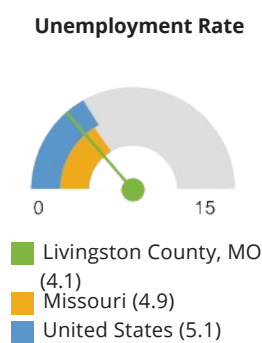

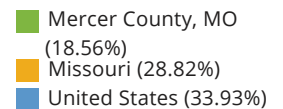

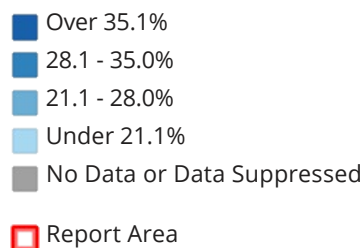

**Uninsured Population, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**



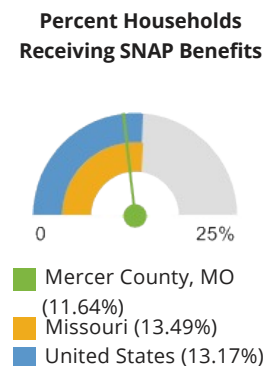

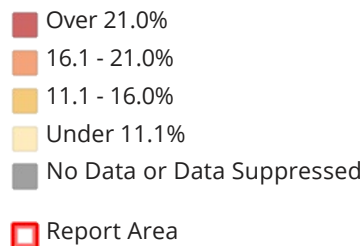

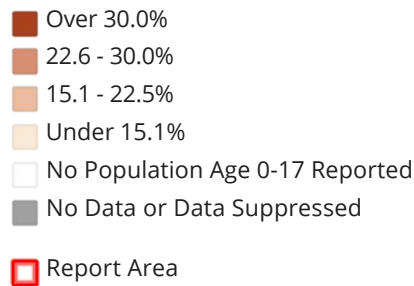

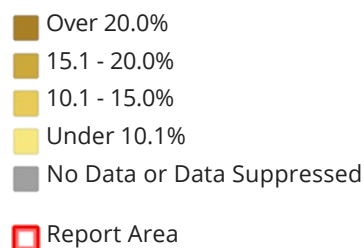

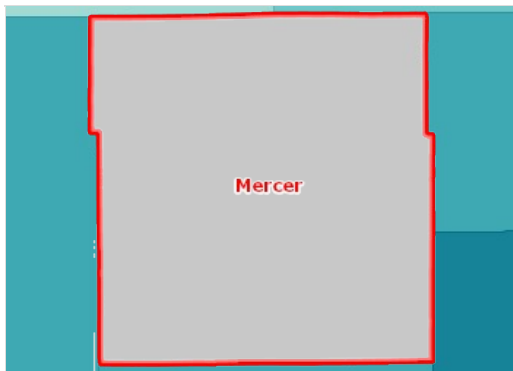

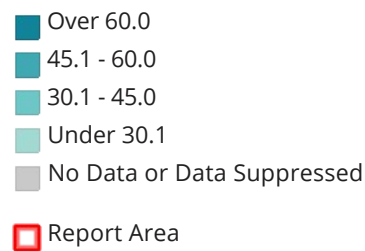
Teen Birth Rate (Per 1,000 Population)

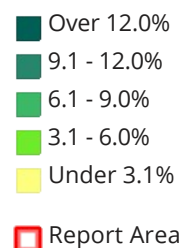

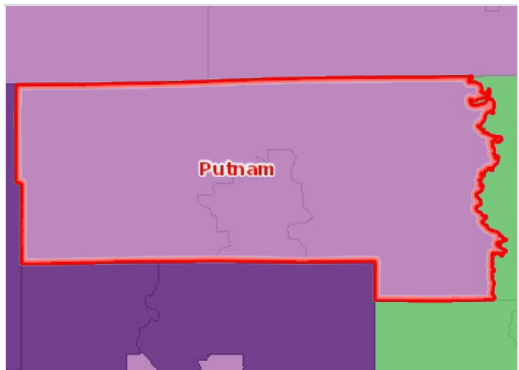

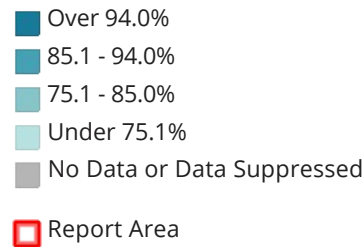

**On-Time Graduation, Rate by School District (Secondary), ED Facts 2014-15**

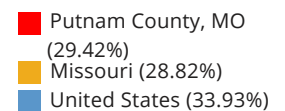
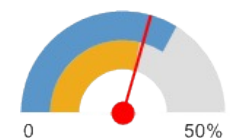

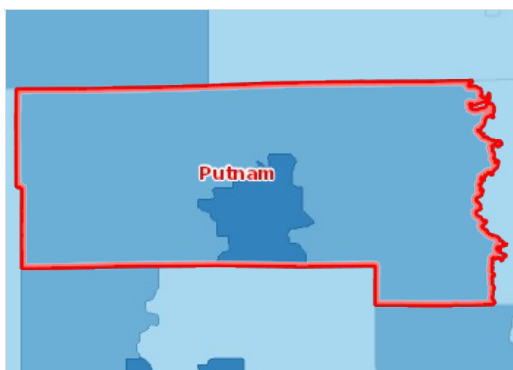

**Percentage of Households where Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Income**

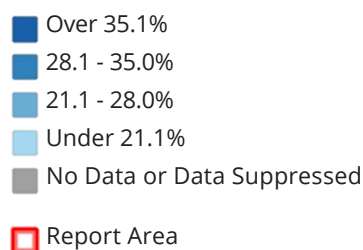

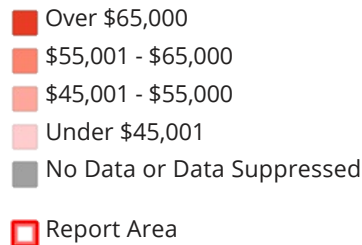

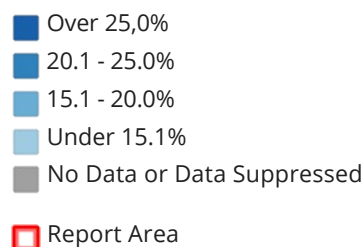

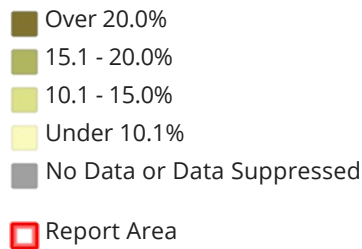

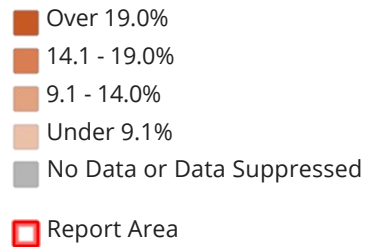
Percent Households

**Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

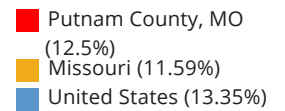

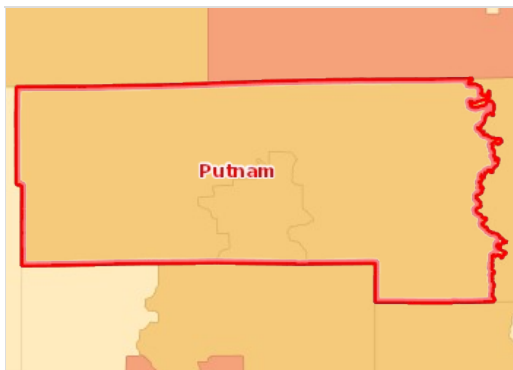

**Percent Population Age 25 with No High School Diploma**

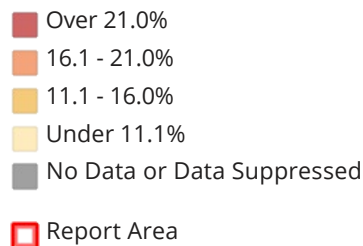

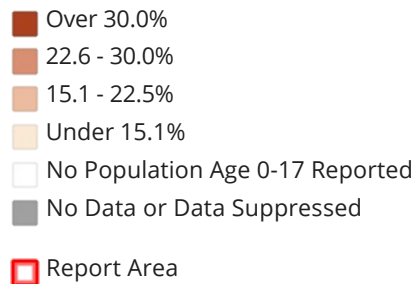

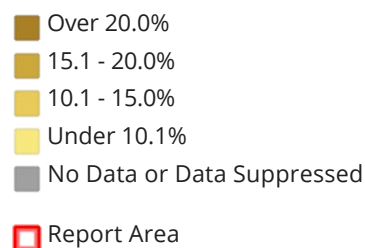

**On-Time Graduation, Rate by School District (Secondary), ED Facts 2014-15**

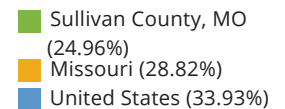

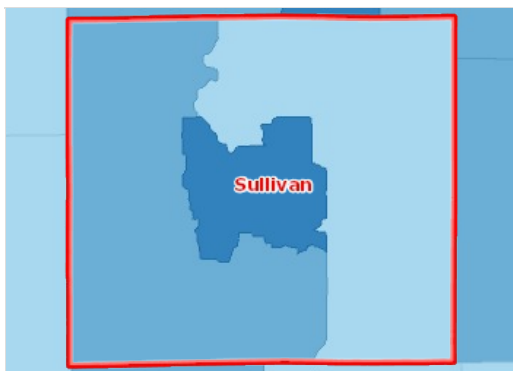

**Percentage of Households where Housing Costs Exceed 30% of Income**

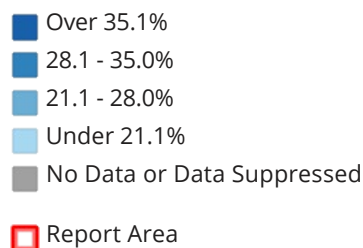

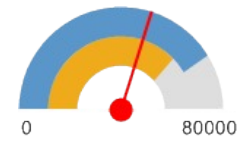

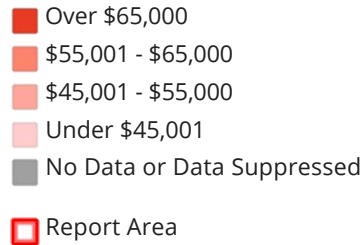
#### Median Family Income

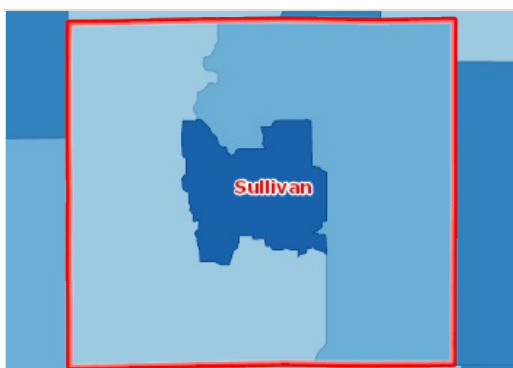

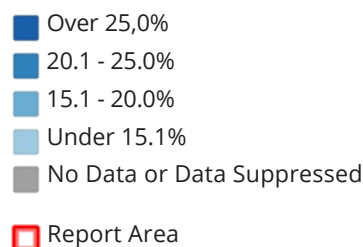
#### Percent of Insured Population Receiving Medicaid

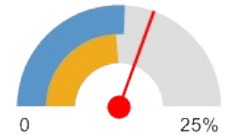

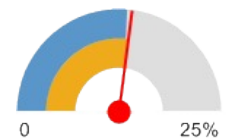

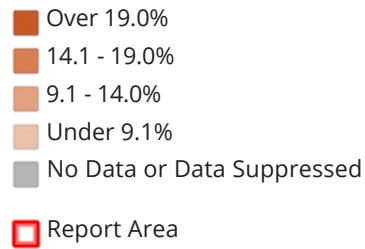
Percent Households Receiving SNAP Benefits

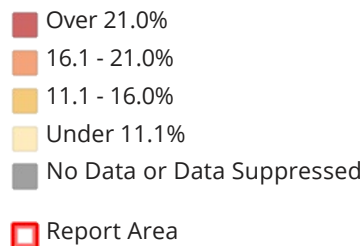

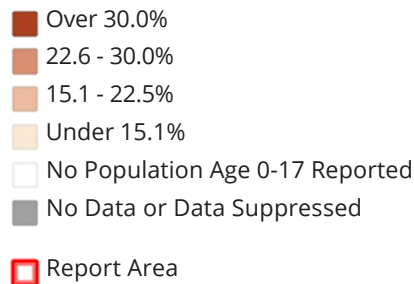

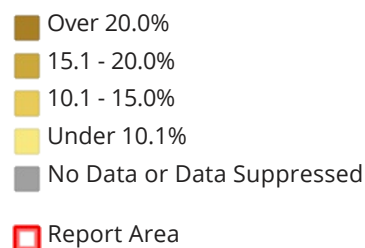

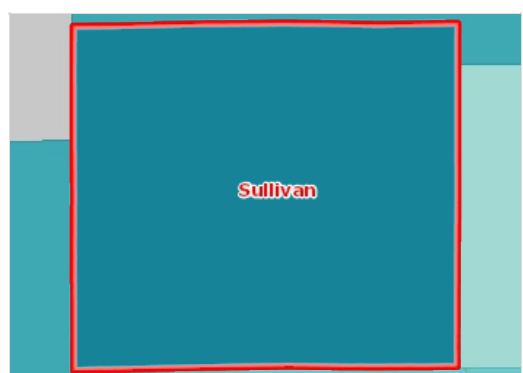

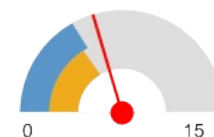

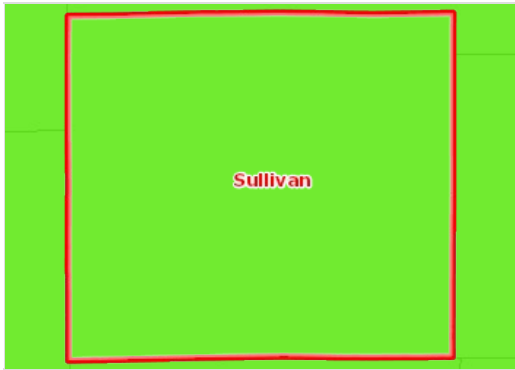

# Executive Summary

Community Action Partnership of North Central Missouri (CAPNCM) is a charitable non-profit organization and the designated Community Action Agency serving primarily Caldwell, Daviess, Grundy, Harrison, Linn, Livingston, Mercer, Putnam, and Sullivan Counties. We offer a wide range of services for low wage earners and vulnerable populations, including Community Services, Women's Health Services, Weatherization, Housing Assistance, and Housing Development.

Community Services – Services funded by the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) to reduce poverty, revitalize low-income communities, and empower low-income families/individuals in rural, and urban, areas to become fully self-sufficient.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) – This program offers basic funds for Energy Assistance (EA) and Energy Crisis Intervention (ECIP) funds for households in which utilities have been disconnected, or are in immediate threat of being disconnected.

Employment & Training – The Missouri Work Assistance (MWA) program is designed to assist those receiving Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) by helping individuals/families gain job skills and education needed in order to obtain employment.

Weatherization – This program offers homeowners, and renters, an opportunity to improve the quality of their home, by increasing the energy efficiency of the home.

Housing Assistance – The Housing Choice Voucher Program funded by Housing and Urban Development (HUD) assists low-income individuals/families to be able to afford decent, safe, and sanitary housing.

Housing Development – This program assists low-income individuals/families in their effort to have safe, decent, and affordable housing by providing single-family and multi-family rental units, and by improving older homes so they can remain in their home for a greater number of years.

Women's Health Services – This program provides Title X Family Planning Services including birth control, annual exams, general reproductive healthcare, and STD screening to individuals in need, regardless of income (sliding-fee scale)

CAPNCM has been a local leader in the nationwide fight against poverty since 1965. We have built a sustainable and coordinated system of opportunities for north central Missouri families and communities. CAPNCM employs 27 Community Action individuals in the nine (9) county service area.

## Overview of Strategic Planning Process

The 2017 Community Action Partnership of North Central Missouri (CAPNCM) Community Needs Assessment is an assessment report on the demographics, needs, and trends affecting the nine (9) counties covered by CAPNCM in Northern Missouri. It is designed to create the agency-wide Strategic Plan for the next three (3) years (2018-2020.)

As a Community Action Agency, CAPNCM receives federal Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) funds distributed through the Missouri Department of Social Services – Family Services Division. As a CSBG recipient, every three (3) years, CAPNCM conducts a strategic planning process in order to assess the needs that exist among low wage earners, and the most vulnerable people in our service area. Our goal is to cre-

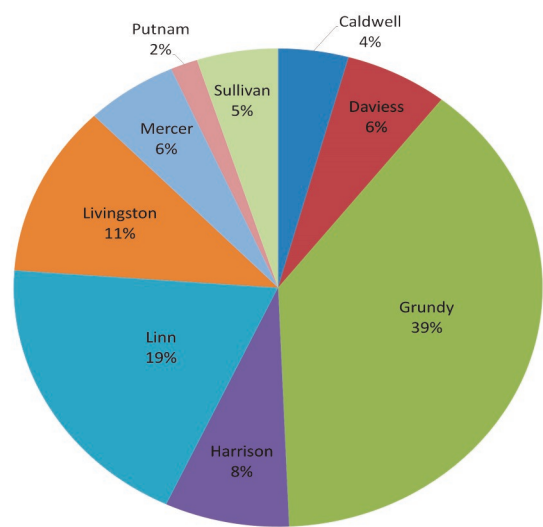
ate a plan to address those needs over the next three (3) years. This process is reviewed annually to make plan course corrections. This process includes a comprehensive Community Needs Assessment, which provides an opportunity to assess the state of ongoing issues while identifying new, and changing, goals and needs.

Between April 2017 and June 2017, CAPNCM's planning committee surveyed customers, staff and board members and facilitated focus groups. Data was collected, reviewed and analyzed along with secondary data from Community Commons and CAPNCM's Management Information Systems.

In order to analyze the data, the results from the *Citizen Surveys* were examined for underlying "themes". These results were then compiled with those from the partner surveys, staff surveys, and focus groups, to create a "master list" of community needs. Below are the results of the Comprehensive Needs Assessment that will be used to prioritize, and lead the agency in the coming years.

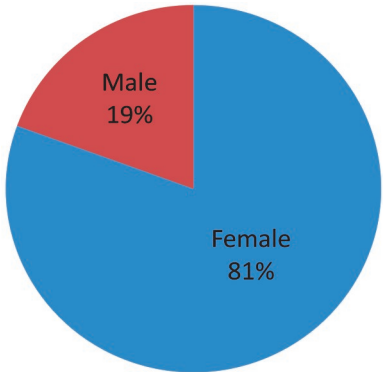
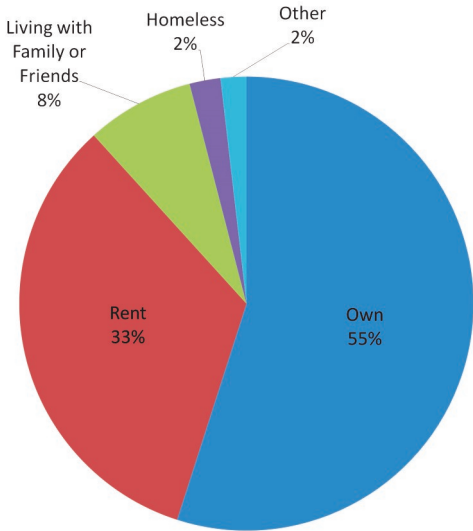

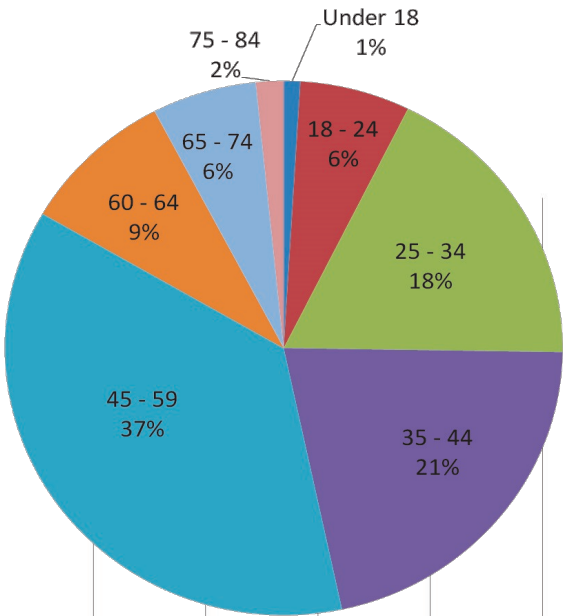
Of the 9 counties we serve, the greatest response came from Grundy County, with 39% of total replies, while Putnam County accounted for only 2% of the returned surveys.

Living Situations



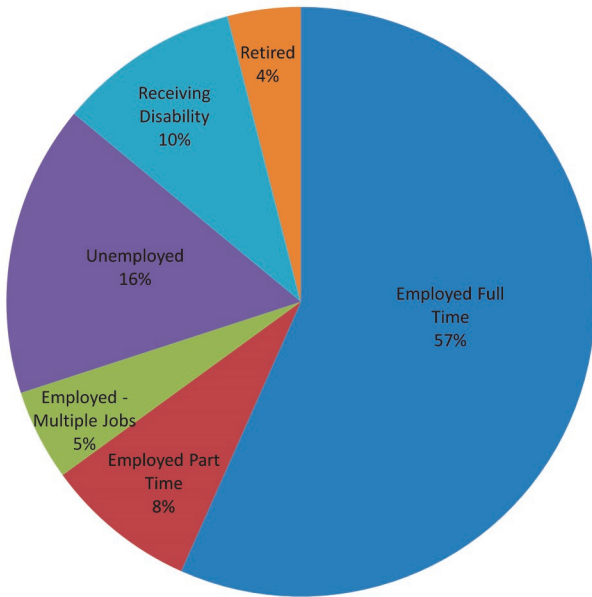
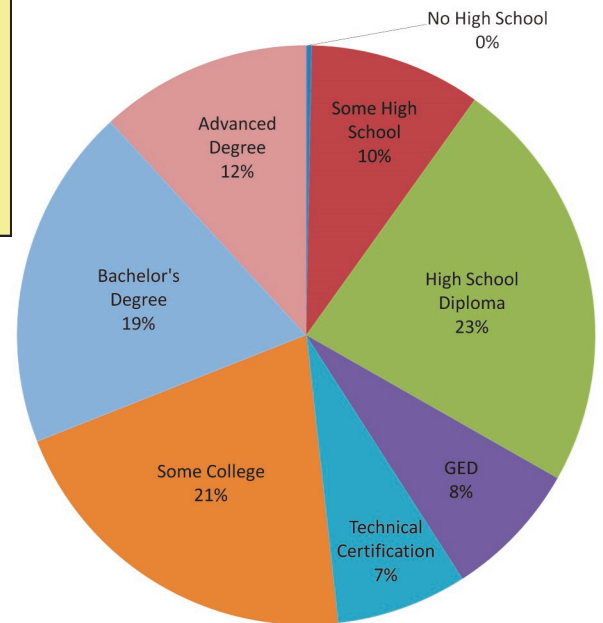

Ages of Respondents

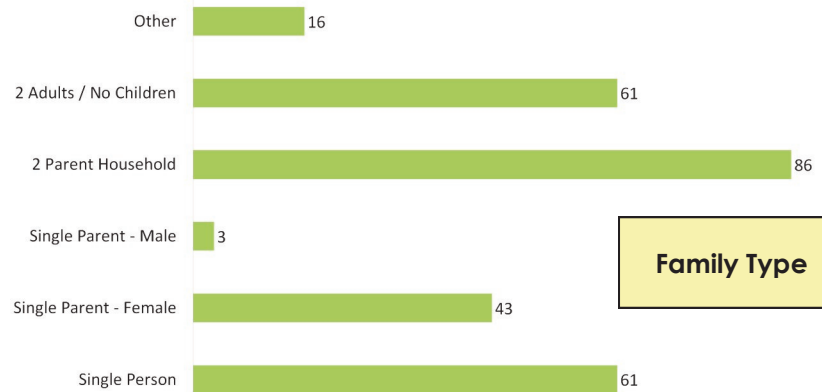


The racial/ethnic background of survey respondents shows a breakdown very similar to what we see in available census data for our service counties.

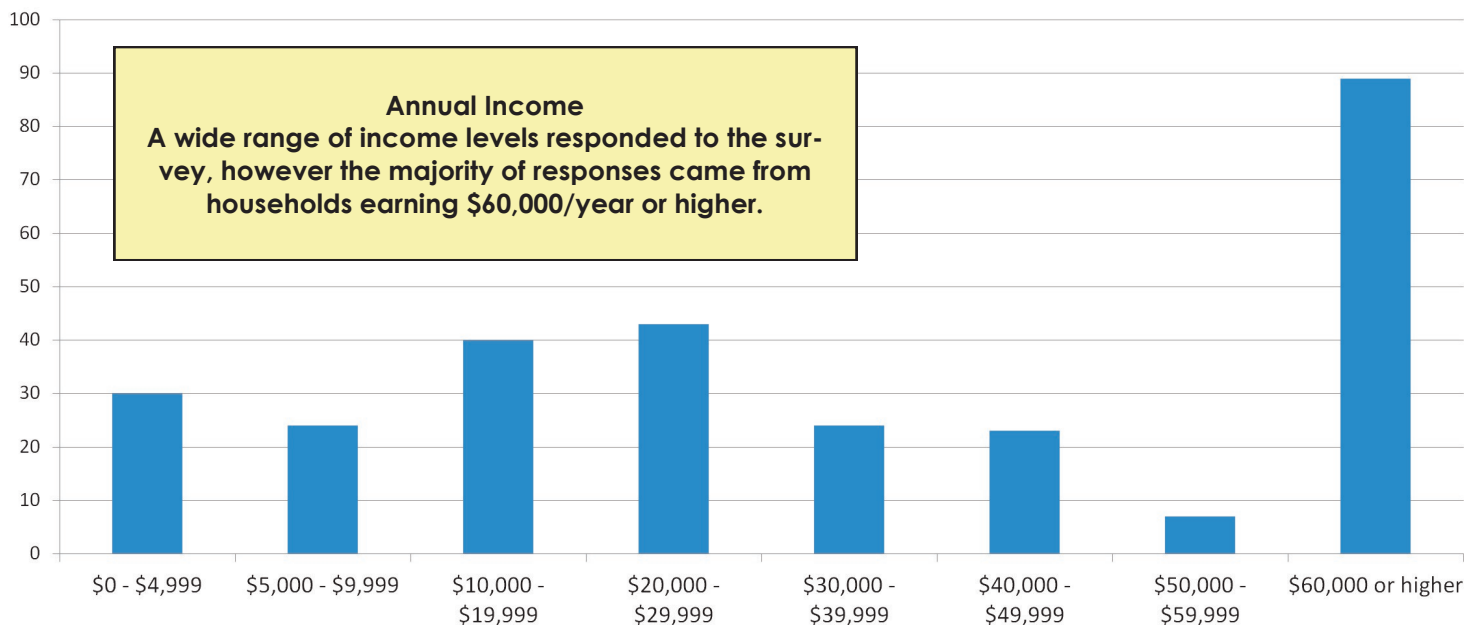
31% of those polled were high school graduates or had received a GED. 52% went on to obtain some form of higher education. While just 10% had not graduated high school.

# assessment findings

The 2017 Community Needs Assessment Survey was made publically available across our nine county area of northern Missouri. The initial survey was released online using Survey Monkey ([www.surveymonkey.com](http://www.surveymonkey.com)), paper copies were mailed and distributed to a random sampling of agency clients, community members, and agency partners. Results were then compiled online and translated into a series of graphs for easy viewing.

Each respondent was given a series of situations related to employment, education, transportation, housing, emergency situations, financial situations, and nutrition within their communities and asked to rate them on a scale of 1-5 based on the perceived importance of that situation in their community to overcoming poverty. These opinions will help give our agency direction when formulating new programs and services for the upcoming fiscal years.

Top five issues within our counties were:

- Employment - Lack of jobs & lack of living wage jobs
- Housing - Lack of safe, affordable, quality housing
- Transportation - Lack of public and/or private
- Drug/Alcohol Abuse
- Education - need for life skills education

The information gathered will help to guide Community Action Partnership of North Central Missouri in the upcoming years. The information will allow us to better meet the needs of our 9 county service area. This information will also help guide our agency as we develop our strategic plan.

# What the Current Data Shows

## Population:

On average statewide, population has increased by 8%, however there has been a population decrease in 6 of our 9 counties, while only 3 counties have seen a rise in population.

**Comparing Current Numbers to Previous Findings**

When summarizing our numbers and results from this year, we were able to compare them to numbers we’ve gathered in the past, via both previous needs assessments and other data collection avenues mentioned on previous pages of this report. The findings below create a basic glimpse of changes within our service area over time.

**Population**

The population has steadily decreased in our region over time, however population more recent drops were not as drastic as what we have seen in previous years.

**Unemployment**

Current data does show that unemployment fell across the report area since 2013 by around 3%

**Education**

Residents of our service area attaining their high school diploma has risen several percentage points since the year 2000, but these numbers still remain below the state average. Residents obtaining college degrees are also well below the state and national average.

**Juvenile Court Referrals**

Harrison County saw a huge jump in reported juvenile cases, while Livingston, Mercer, and Putnam saw minimal increases. Our five remaining service area counties saw a decrease in overall juvenile court referrals.

**Domestic Violence/Violent Crimes/Property Crimes**

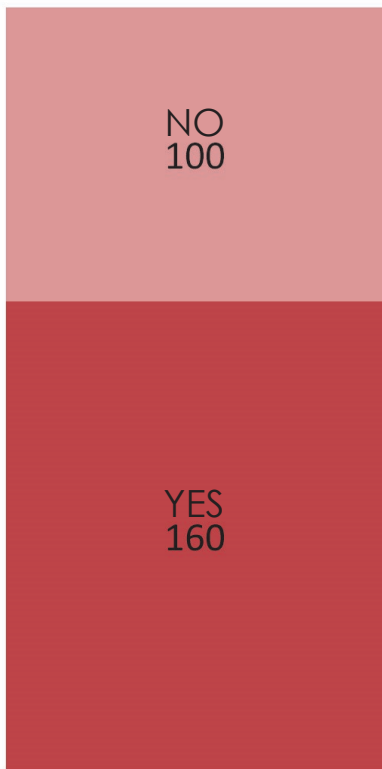
Incidences of domestic violence within our service area have remained mostly steady. Violent crime was almost a non-issue in our service area, with numbers well below state and national averages. Aggravated assault was the only area in which we noticed an overall increase from prior years.

**Income**

There has been a slight increase across our service area in annual household income since 2012. Hourly wages also rose, but both remain below state and national averages.

**Teen Births**

The teen birth number saw a huge jump in both Sullivan and Daviess Counties, and an overall increase within our service area of around 5% since 2012. The counties of Putnam, Mercer, Livingston, Linn, Harrison, and Caldwell all saw decreases, with Grundy county seeing a slight increase.

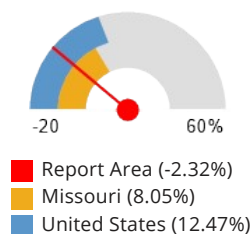

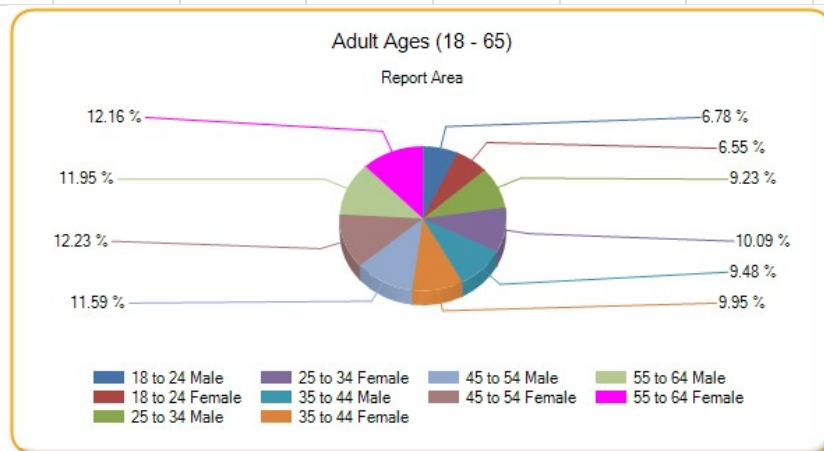


Median Age by Tract, ACS 2011-15



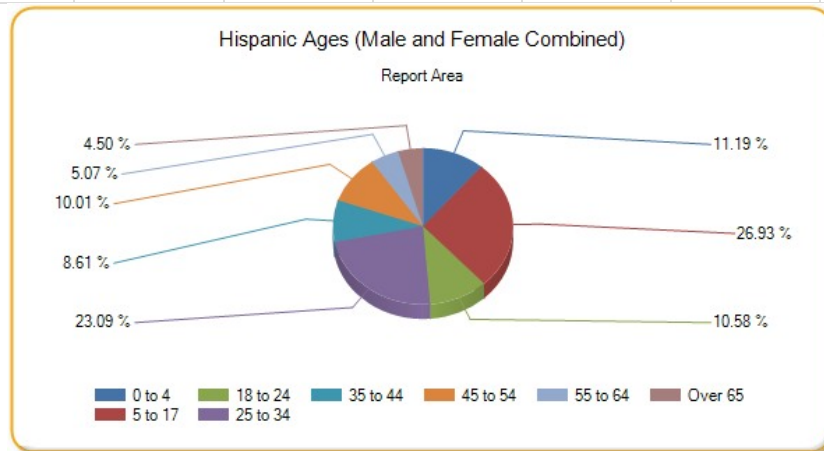

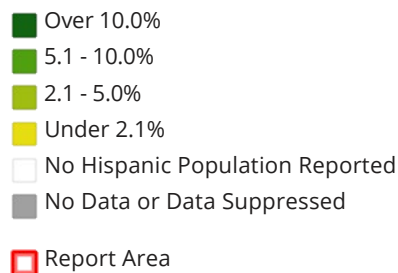

Population, Minority (Non-White), Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

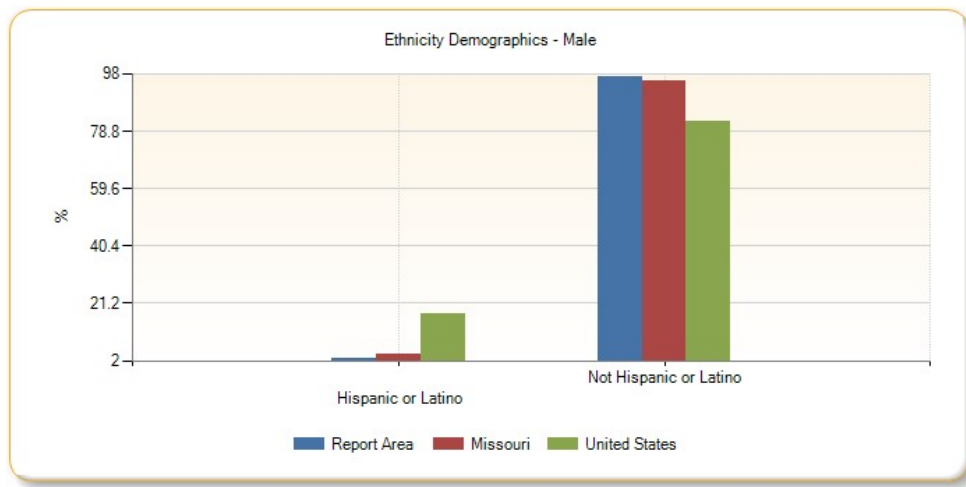

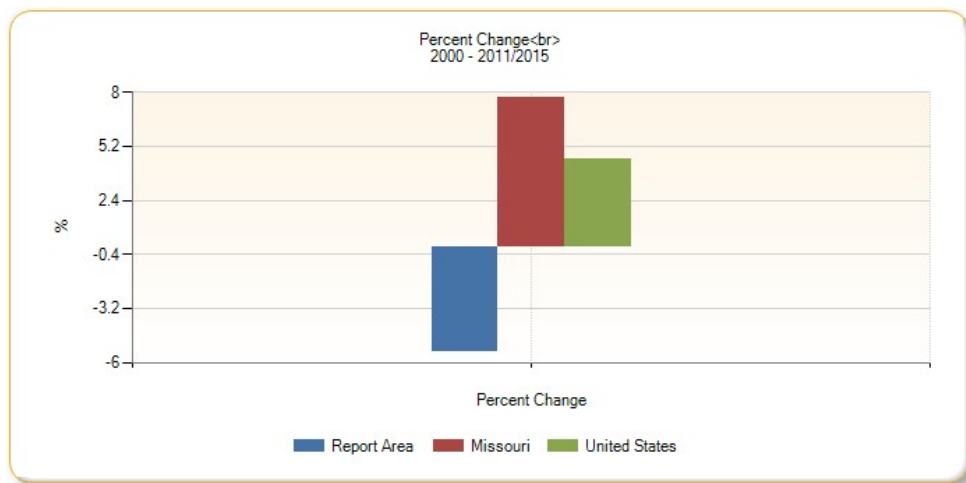

**Total Households by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

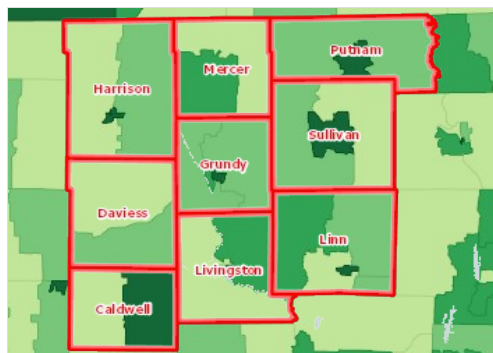
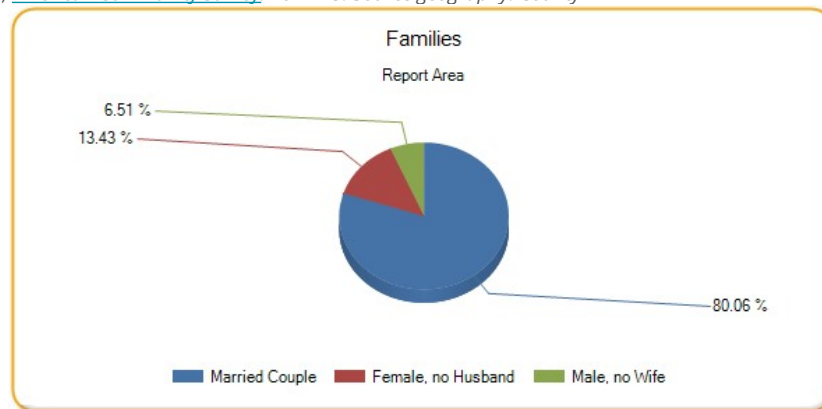

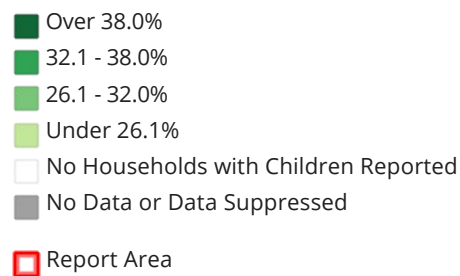

**Single Parent Households with Children (Age 0-17), Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

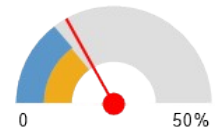

**Population Below the Poverty Level, Percent by County, SAIPE 2015**

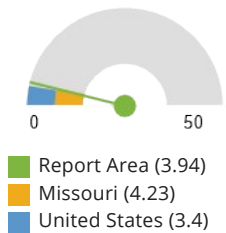

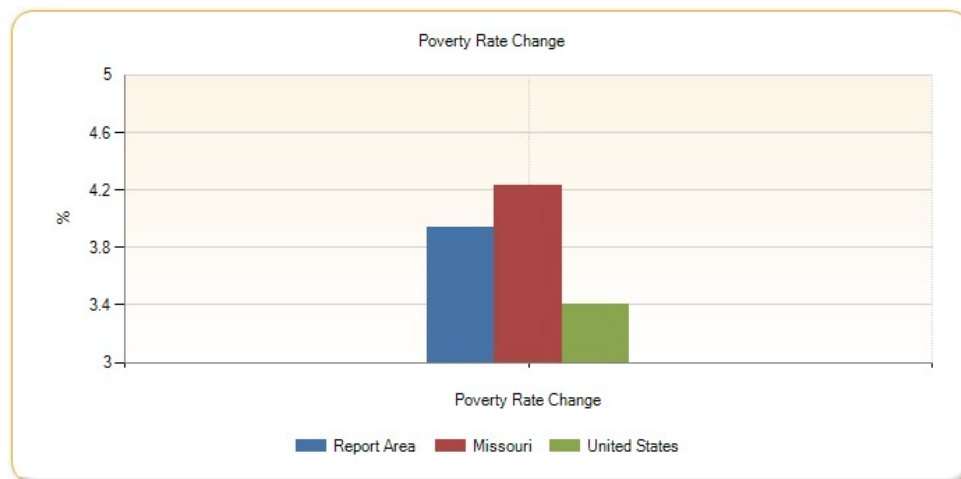

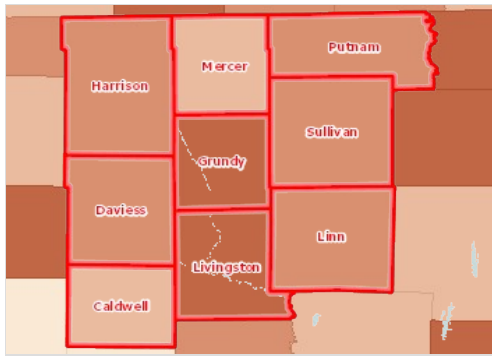
Change in Poverty Rate 2000-2015



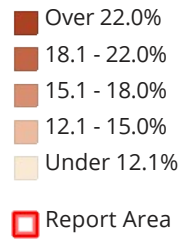

**Population Below the Poverty Level, Percent by County, SAIPE 2015**

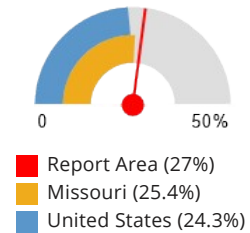

**Family Households Living Below the Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

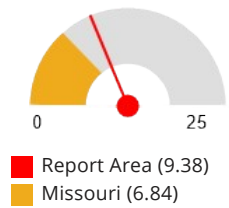

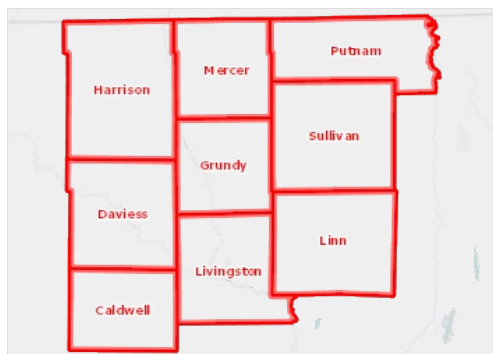

**Violent Crimes, All, Rate (Per 100,000 Pop.) by County, FBI UCR 2010-12**



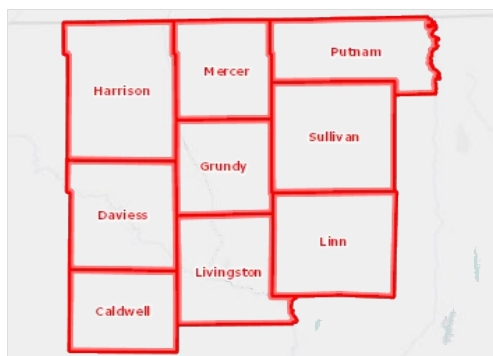

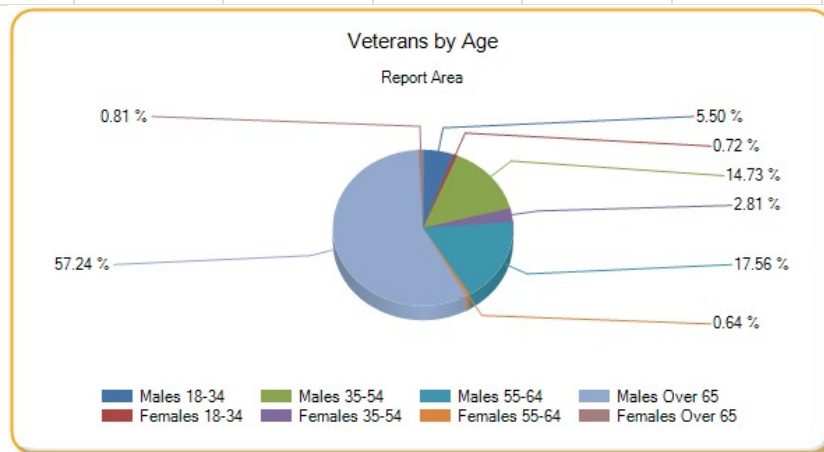
**Veterans, Percent of Total Population by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

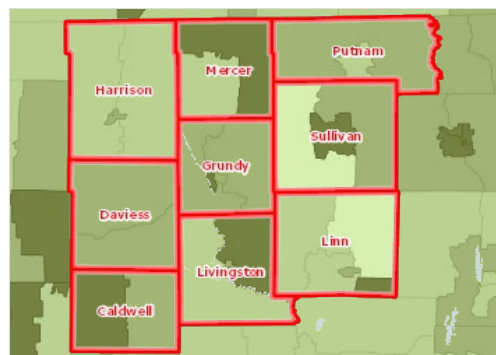

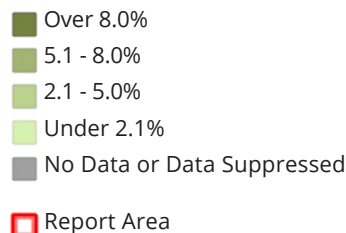

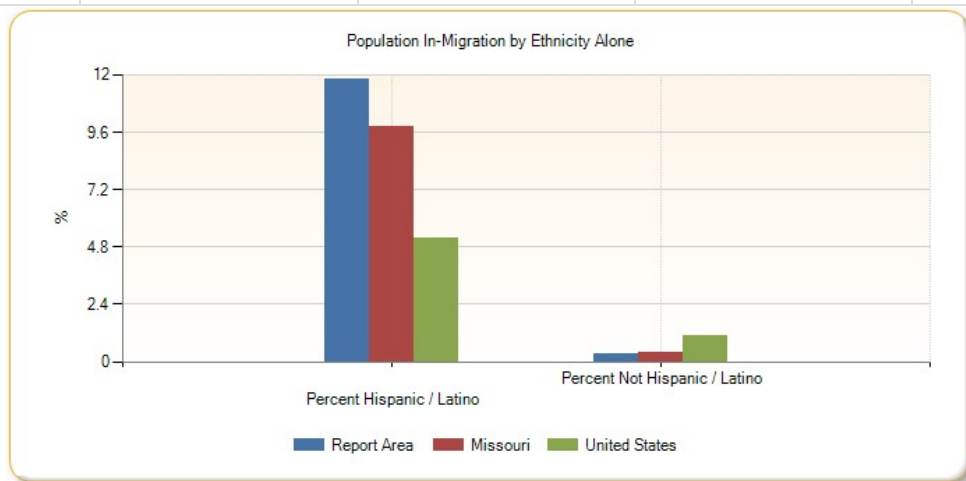
**Population Migrated from Outside of the County, State, or Country, Percent of Total Population by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

### Unemployment, Rate by County, BLS 2017 - March

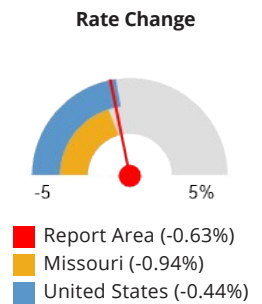

### Unemployment, Rate by County, BLS 2017 - March

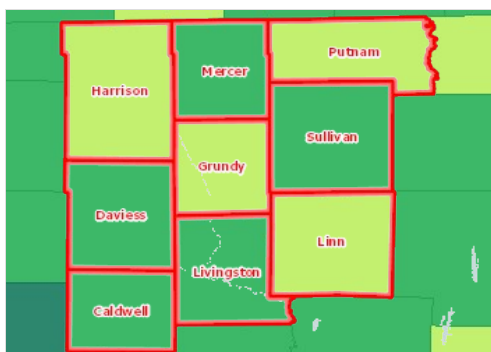
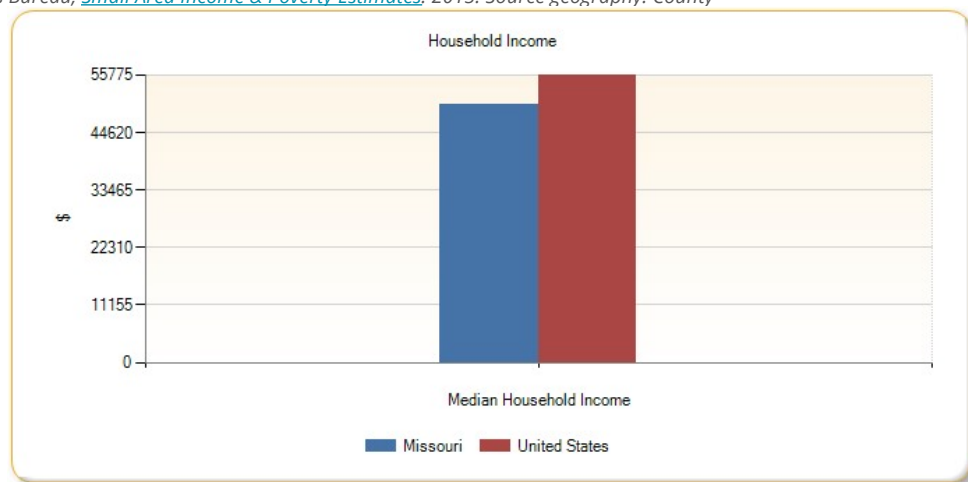

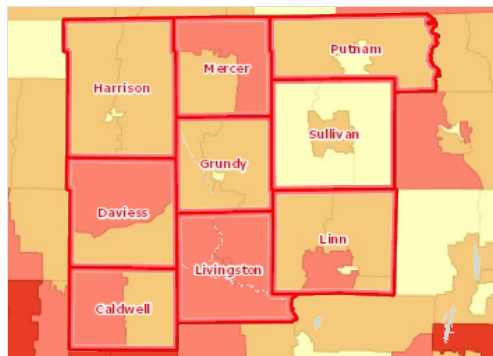

**Average Wage/Salary Income, Average by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

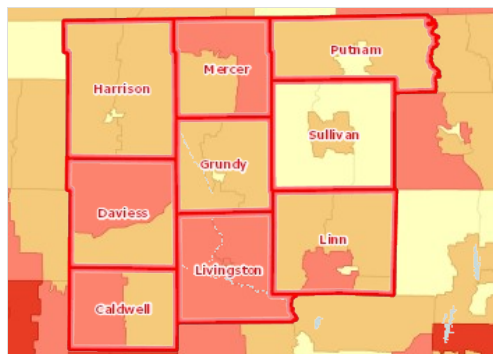

## Child Care Costs

The 2014 Department of Social Services Childcare Market Rate Survey shows the average costs for child care based on responses from licensed care providers in each county. Cost of child care for each type of care and age group for the report area is shown below.

NOTE: The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services, which is responsible for licensing childcare facilities, provided a list of all licensed facilities. Surveys were made available online to 3,323 providers. Providers were notified by multiple email messages as well as a message on the online invoicing system. A total of 121 surveys were completed. All surveys returned were able to be used with only one outlier needing clarification. Surveys returned with no rate for a given category of care had no influence on calculating rate information for that type of care. Because of this, the total number of surveys for each type of care and classification varies depending on the number of providers that reported a rate for that type of care.

Caution should be used in interpreting results where there are few responses in a given geographical area or for a certain type of care. This is especially true with respect to Group Homes. Also, keep in mind that voluntary participation introduces the potential for self-selection bias. With respect to this particular survey, providers charging more than DSS rates may have a perceived incentive to return the survey in the hope of influencing state paid rates. providers charging below or close to the DSS rates may be more satisfied and, therefore, have less incentive to respond. In addition, only licensed providers were surveyed. It is uncertain how the inclusion of unlicensed providers may have affected the results.

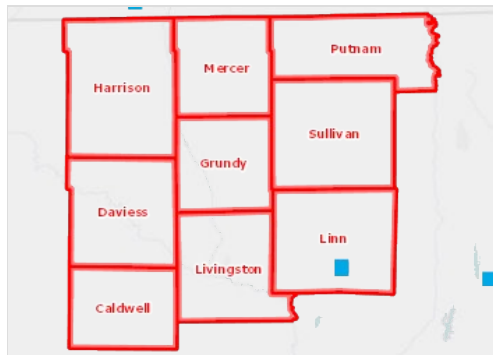

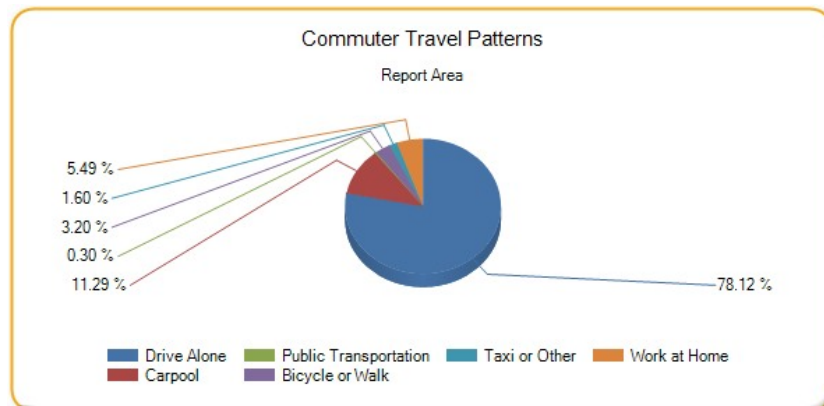

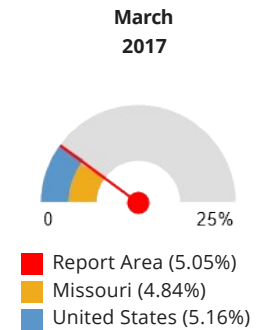
Unemployment, Rate by County, BLS 2017 - March

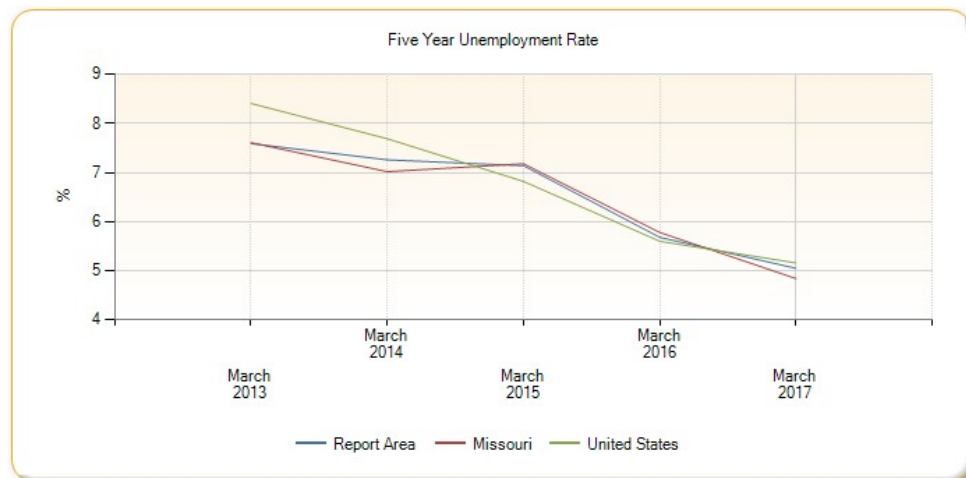

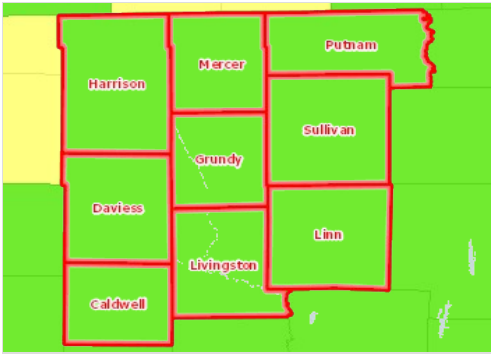

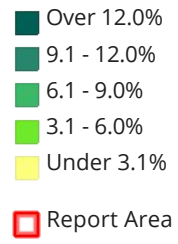

### Unemployment, Rate by County, BLS 2017 - March





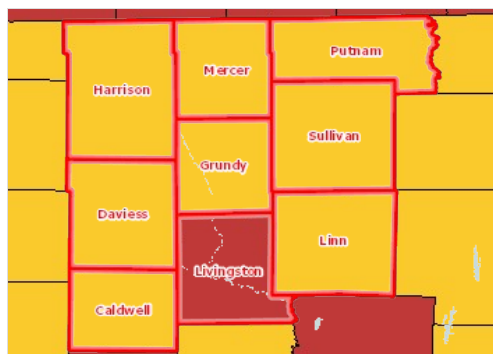

**Environment, Resilience / Vulnerability Quadrant by County, EPSCoR 2015**

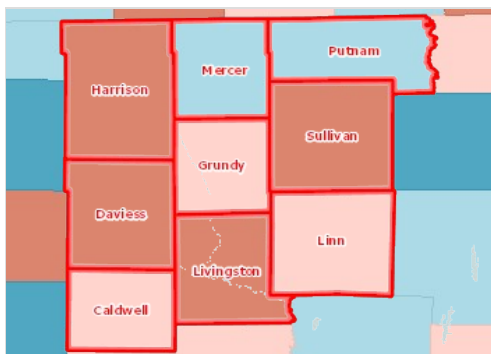

**Population with No High School Diploma (Age 18 ), Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**



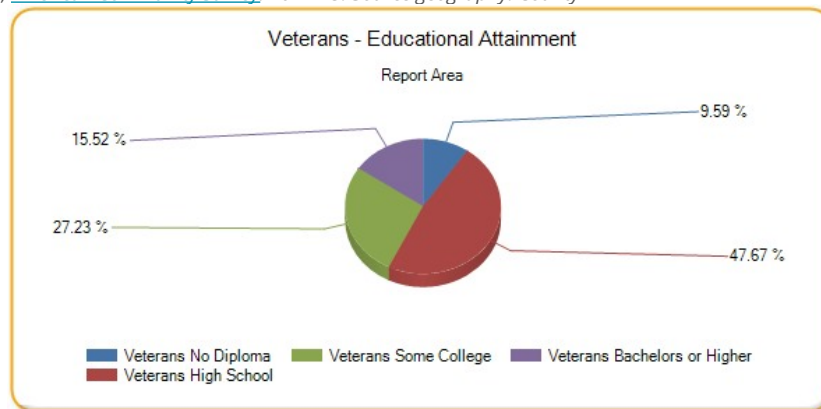

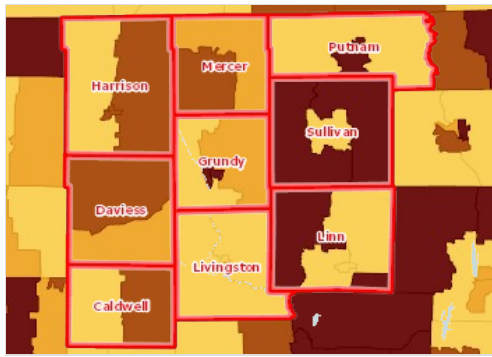

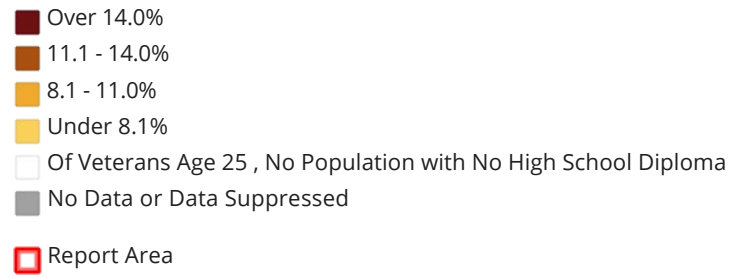

# No High School Diploma, Veterans, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

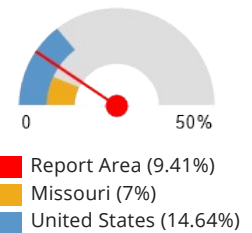

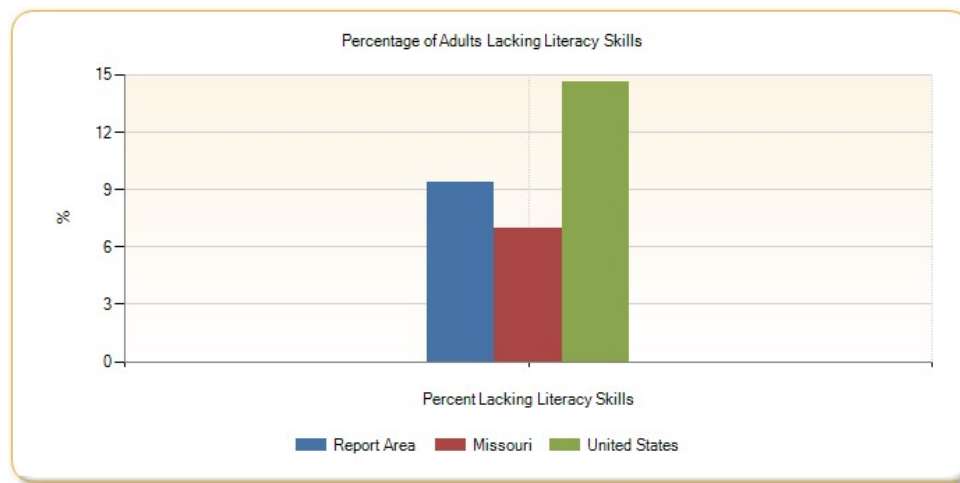

## Child Care Costs

The 2014 Department of Social Services Childcare Market Rate Survey shows the average costs for child care based on responses from licensed care providers in each county. Cost of child care for each type of care and age group for the report area is shown below.

NOTE: The Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services, which is responsible for licensing childcare facilities, provided a list of all licensed facilities. Surveys were made available online to 3,323 providers. Providers were notified by multiple email messages as well as a message on the online invoicing system. A total of 121 surveys were completed. All surveys returned were able to be used with only one outlier needing clarification. Surveys returned with no rate for a given category of care had no influence on calculating rate information for that type of care. Because of this, the total number of surveys for each type of care and classification varies depending on the number of providers that reported a rate for that type of care.

Caution should be used in interpreting results where there are few responses in a given geographical area or for a certain type of care. This is especially true with respect to Group Homes. Also, keep in mind that voluntary participation introduces the potential for self-selection bias. With respect to this particular survey, providers charging more than DSS rates may have a perceived incentive to return the survey in the hope of influencing state paid rates. providers charging below or close to the DSS rates may be more satisfied and, therefore, have less incentive to respond. In addition, only licensed providers were surveyed. It is uncertain how the inclusion of unlicensed providers may have affected the results.

### Occupied Housing Units, Percent by Tract, ACS 2010-14

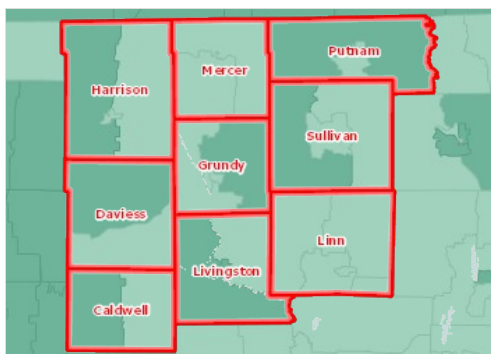
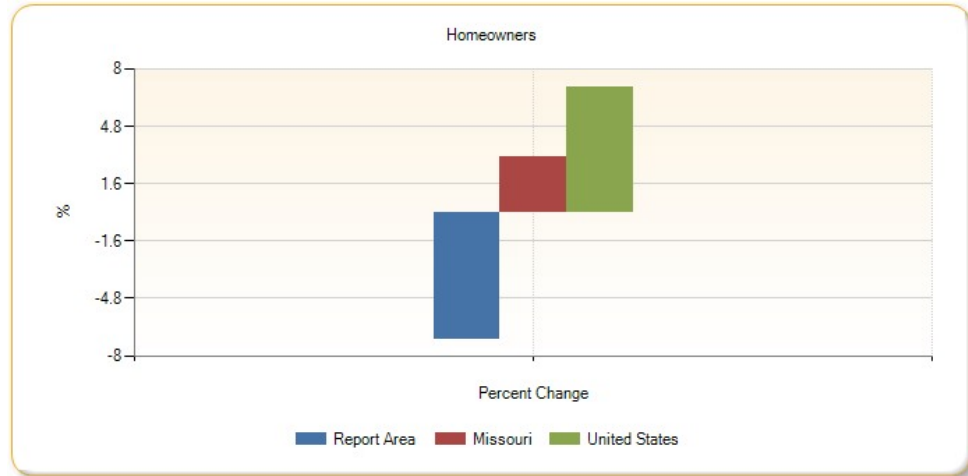

### Homeowner Property Taxes, Average by Tract, ACS 2011-15

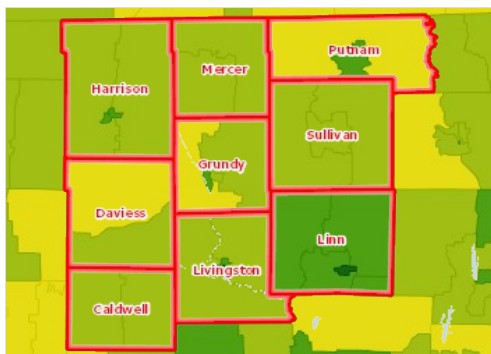

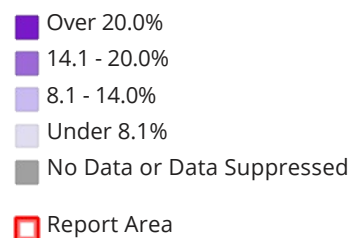

**Vacant Housing Units, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

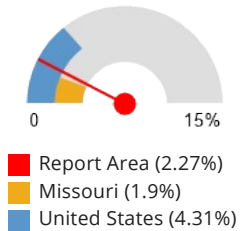

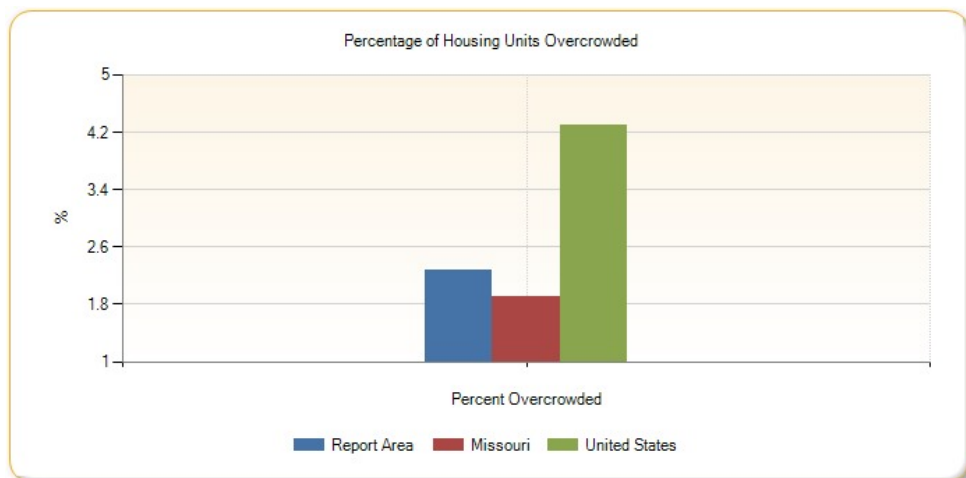

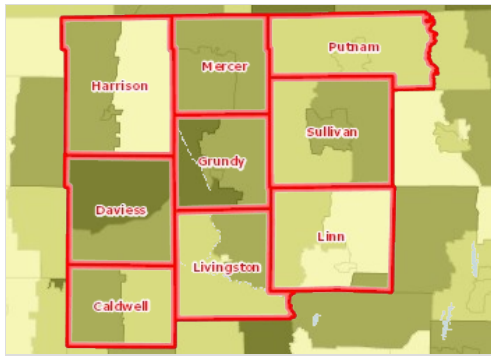
Percentage of Housing Units Overcrowded



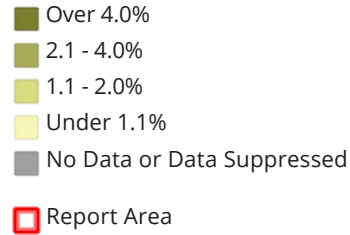

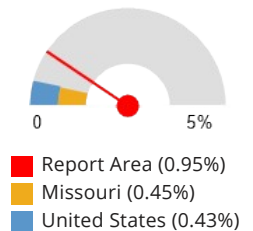

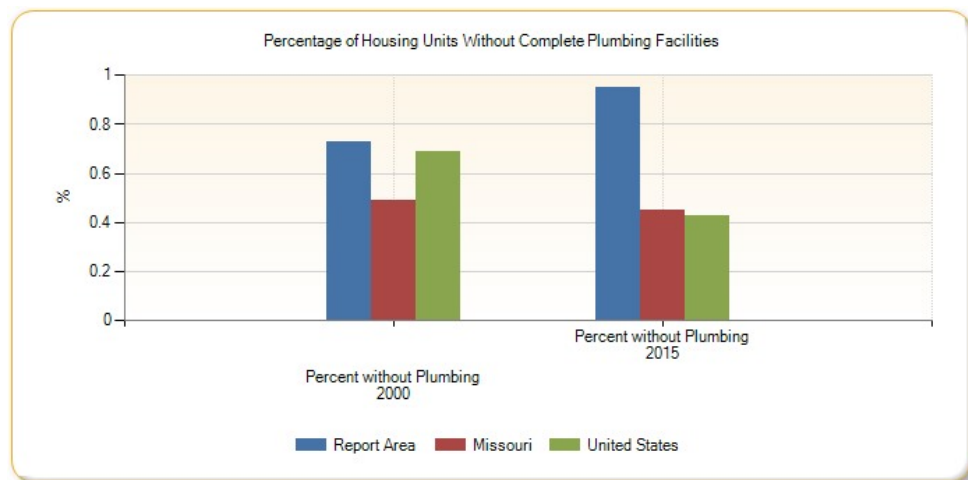

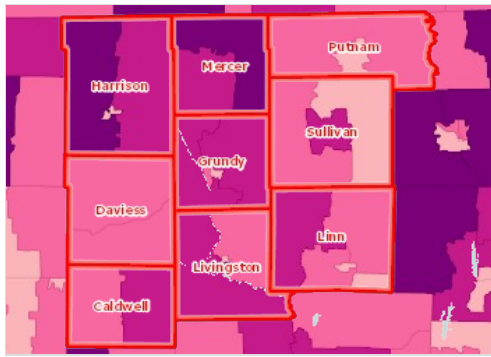
**Percentage of Housing Units Without Complete Plumbing Facilities**



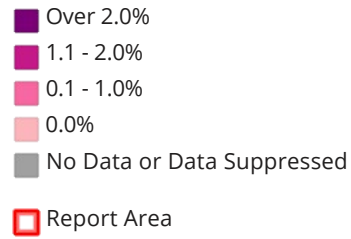

**Housing Units Lacking Complete Plumbing Facilities, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

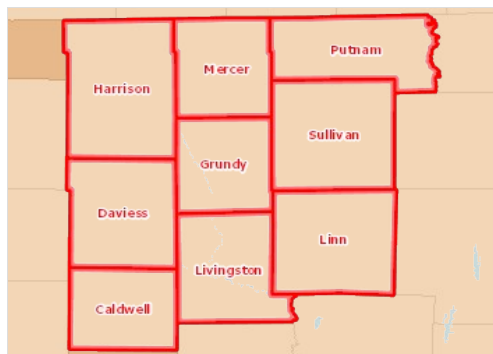

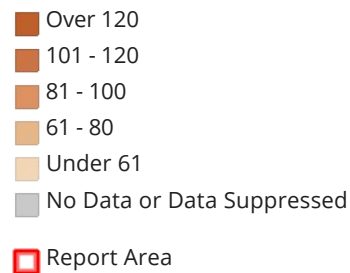

**Hours per Week at Minimum Wage Needed to Afford Housing, 1-Bedroom (at FMR) by County, NLIHC 2016**

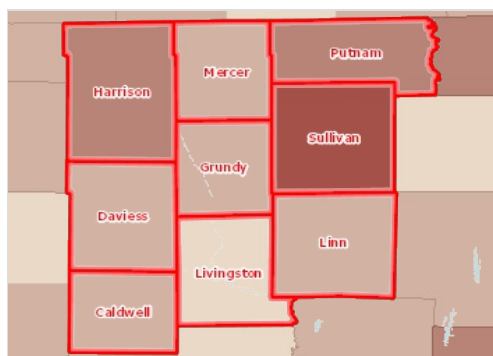

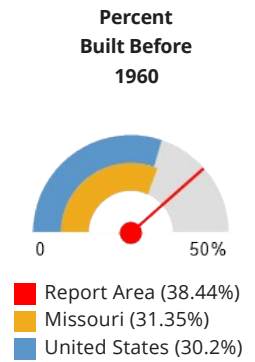
**Monthly Homeowner Housing Costs, All Units, Median by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

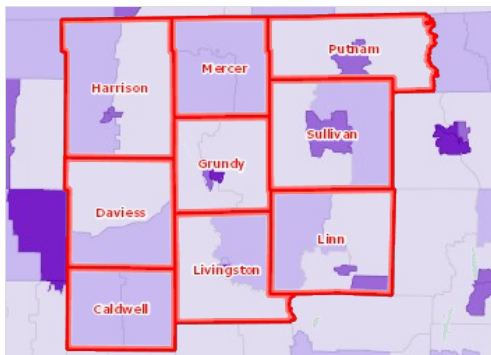

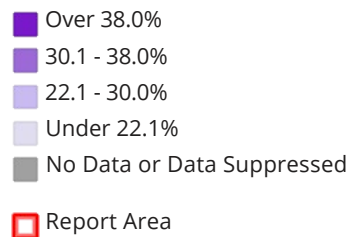

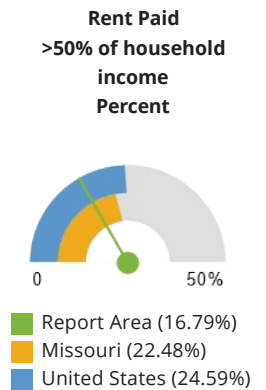
### Renter-Occupied Housing Units, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

### Per Capita Income by Tract, ACS 2011-15

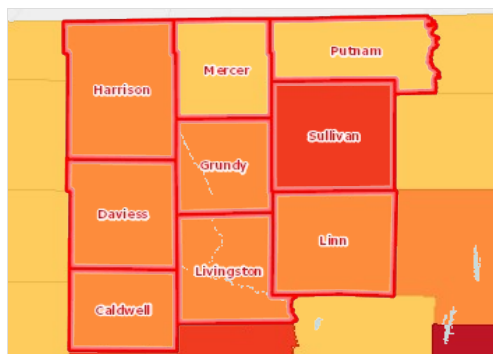

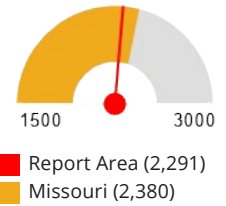

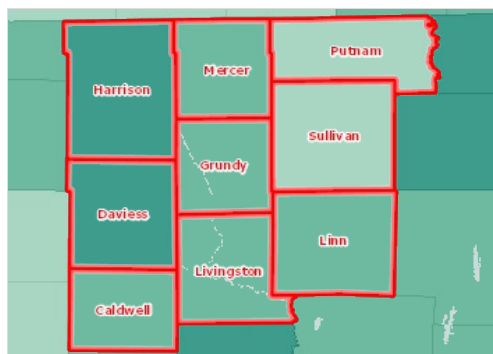

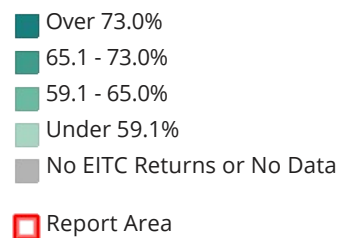

Earned Income Tax Credit Returns with AGI Under \$20,000, Percent by County, Brookings EITC 2012

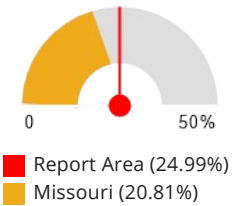

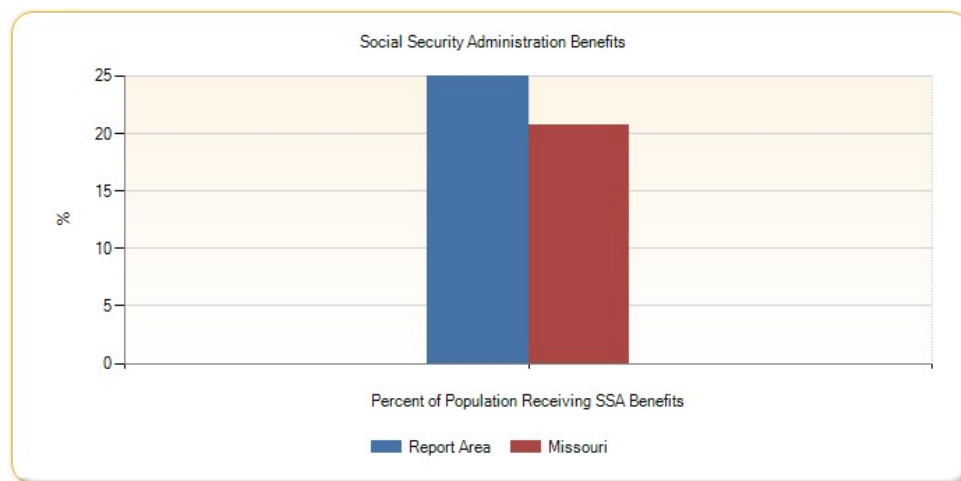
Percent of Population Receiving SSA Benefits

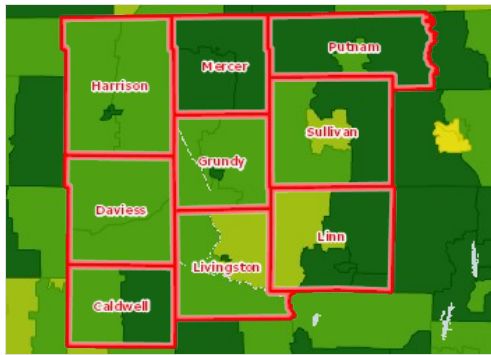

Households with Social Security Income, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

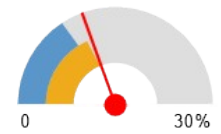

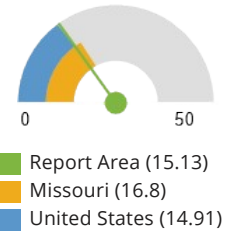

**Food Insecure Population, Percent by County, Feeding America 2013**

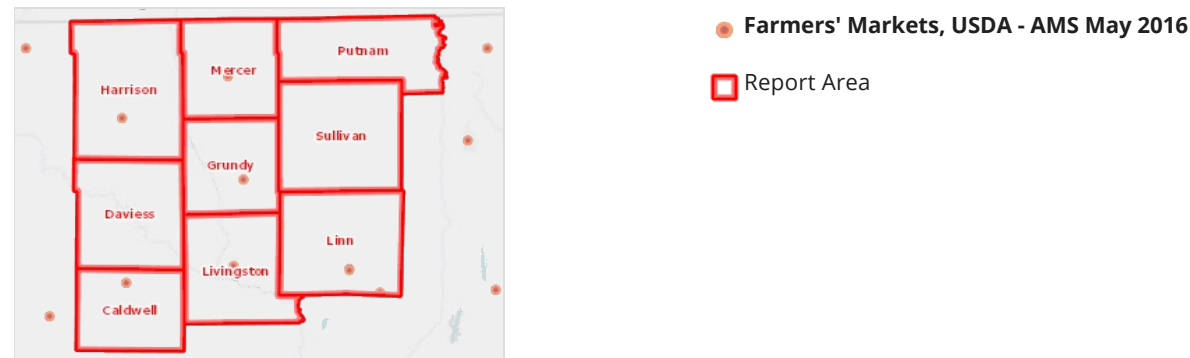

## Population Below 185% Poverty Level, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

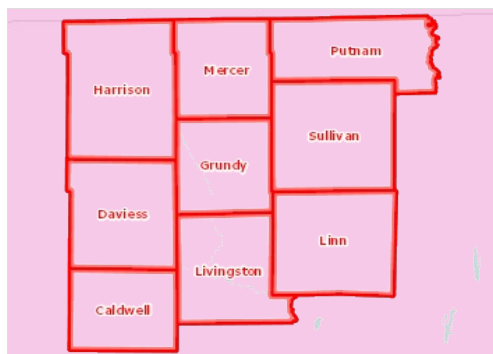

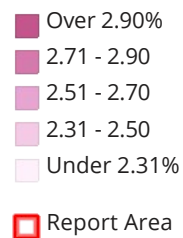

**WIC Participants, Percent of Total Population by State, FEA 2011**

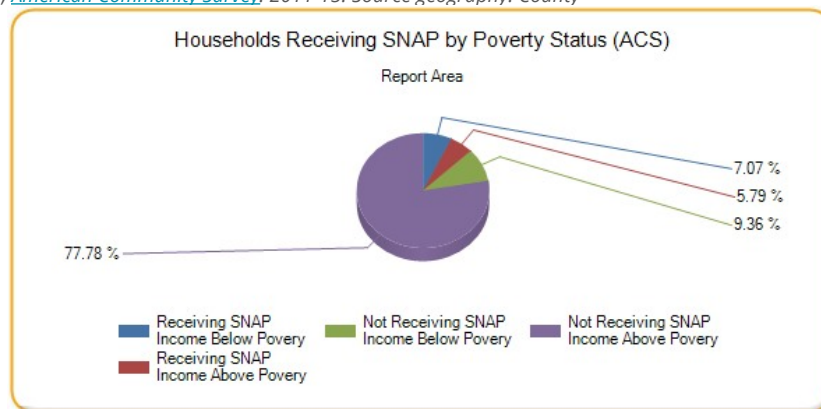


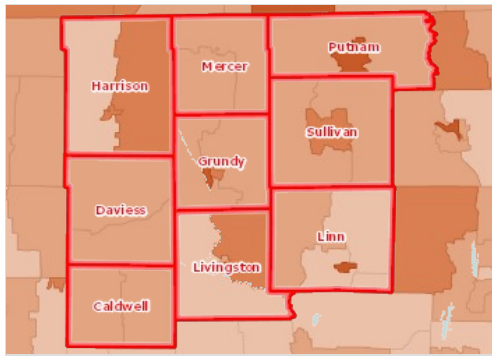

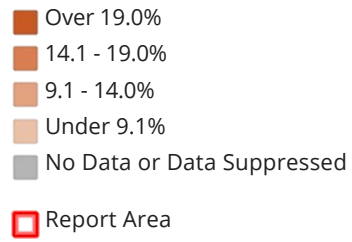

**Households Receiving SNAP Benefits, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**





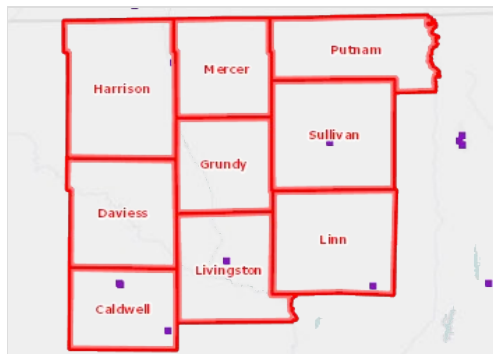

### Vulnerability Index - Infrastructure by County, EPSCOR 2015

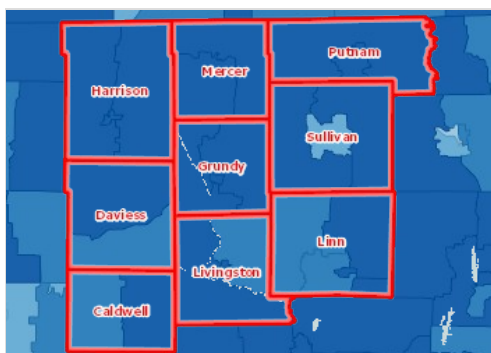
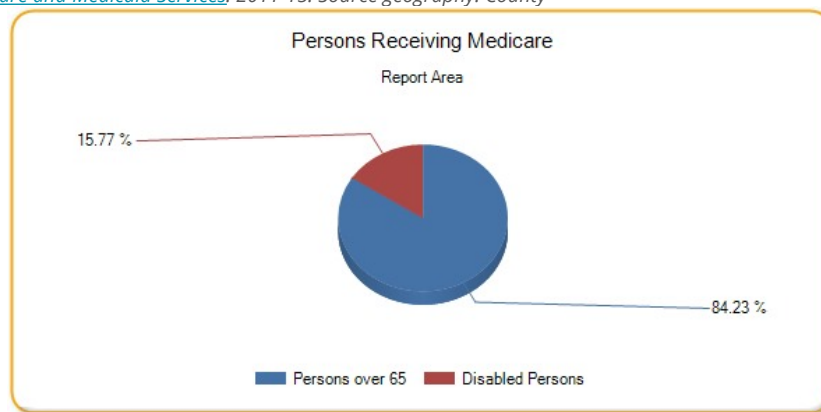

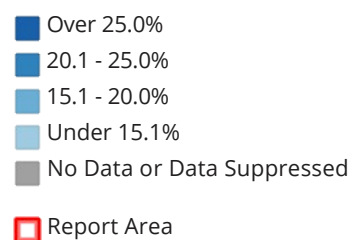

## Insured, Medicare, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15

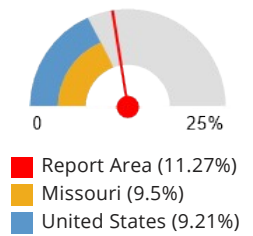

### Uninsured Population, Percent by County, SAHIE 2015

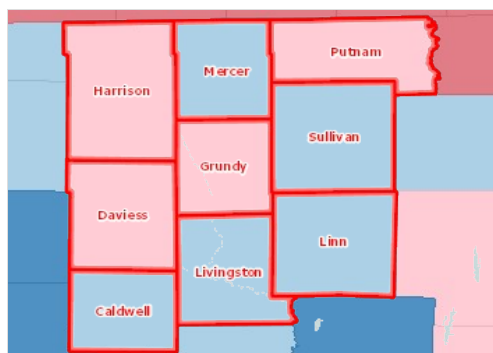

**Women that Gave Birth, Age 15-19, Percent by Tract, ACS 2011-15**

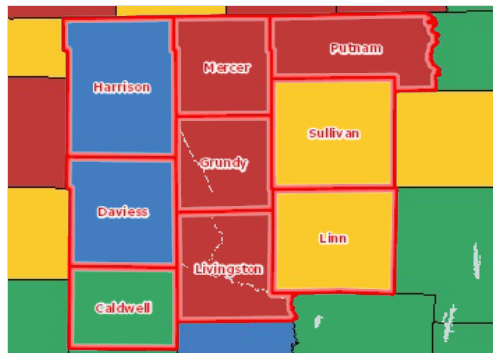

**Economics, Resilience / Vulnerability Quadrant by County, EPSCoR 2015**

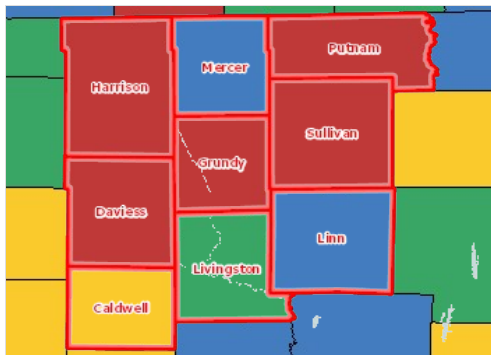

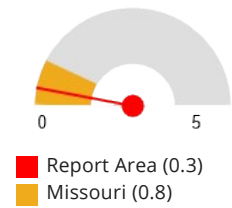

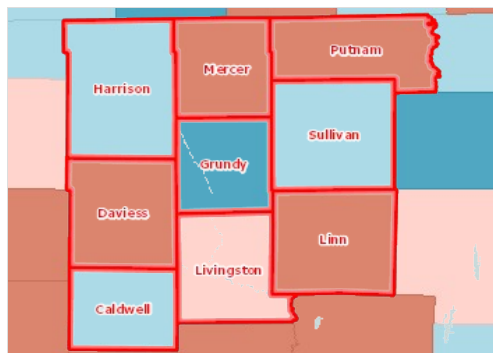
