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MFA Oil Donates to Domestic Violence Shelter

Green Hills Community Action Agency is the proud recipient of a major donation from MFA Oil Company, headquartered in Columbia, Missouri. The donated funds of \$89,000 will be utilized to complete the acquisition of the home used as the Cameron Women's Shelter. Additionally, the donated funds will be used for renovations and future improvements to the facility.

"MFA Oil Company is honored to provide funding for a safe place in the community for victims of domestic violence," said Jerry Taylor, president of MFA Oil Company. "We believe in giving back to the local communities that we serve and we do that through several ways, such as our high school scholarship program, grants from the MFA Oil Foundation and donations like we are giving today."

In receiving the donation, Green Hills Community Action Agency CEO Scott Long vowed that the investment made by MFA Oil "will show its "return" every time an abused woman and/or child leaves this shelter; feeling safe, feeling secure, and being empowered to take on life without fear of their abuser."

Cameron Mayor Dennis Clark provided MFA Oil President Taylor with a Proclamation passed by the City recognizing the company for their commitment to assisting the abuse shelter and being such a good corporate citizen.

MFA Oil Company is a farmer-owned cooperative with more than 40,000 members. The company supplies fuels, lubricants and propane to customers in Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Indiana, Kentucky and Iowa. Through a subsidiary, MFA Oil operates Break Time convenience stores in Missouri and Arkansas and Jiffy Lube and Big O Tire franchises in central Missouri.

Taylor Assumes Shelter Duties

Tammy Taylor has recently been named Program Director for the Domestic Violence Prevention program at Green Hills Community Action Agency's Green Hills Women's Shelters. Taylor, who has been employed with GHCAA for the past several years as Community Services Director, is very excited about the move.

The Green Hills Women's Shelter got its start in 1996, with the opening of the original Women's Shelter location in Trenton, Missouri. 2005 saw the expansion to a second site in Chillicothe, and only one year ago in December of 2009, a third location was opened in Cameron. Serving a 13 county area of Northern Missouri, the Green Hills

Women's Shelters help survivors get their lives back together by providing services including a 24 hour hotline, safe shelter, crisis intervention, case management, legal advocacy, relocation services, housing/utility assistance, job location assistance and training, if necessary, transportation, personal advocacy and referrals. All three shelter facilities operate 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, year-round.

Housing Development in Hamilton

The Green Hills Community Action Agency Housing Development Department is pleased to announce that it will soon begin work on two new construction projects in Hamilton this year.

Green Hills Community Action Agency has been designated as a "CHDO", (Community Housing Development Organization) by Missouri Housing Development Commission. This designation is one of only 21 given to agencies in Missouri and GHCAA is one of the few CHDO's who remain active in developing affordable housing.

Funding for homes and apartments consists of grants, loans, and investments secured from the Missouri Housing Development Commission (MHDC) and other sources as available.

Cur-rent projects funded and under development or those completed provide housing for 113 families. Housing consists of 50 apartments, 63 single-family homes, and 50 partnership units consisting of 36 Senior units and 11 Supportive Housing units.

Assistance to individuals may simply include consultations enabling them to secure the best home at an affordable cost; or it may involve the agency becoming the building/ homeowner providing an afford-able rental home to persons in need of housing.

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GHCAA Gets Growing!!

Green Hills Community Action Agency is beginning its second year sponsoring a large scale community garden project in Grundy County. Last year over 130 families participated! Some of them planted gardens in their own back yards, while others planted on a plot of land that is leased to GHCAA by the Trenton First Christian Church.

First Christian Church has utilized the space around their building for mission work that has offered thousands of families help through projects such as the Church Women United Thrift Store, an activity center, the Grundy County Food Pantry, and now the Grundy County Community Garden. While both the food pantry and the thrift store have independent boards and dozens of volunteers to run them, the First Christian Church has provided

land at a very reduced cost to make these dreams become a reality.

In addition to planting a plot, the program could also use volunteers to help package seeds when they arrive in April. Last year, agency staff and volunteers packaged over 7000 seed packets.

If your business, organization, or family is not interested in participating with a garden plot of its own, please consider sponsoring a family annually instead. A one year, one family sponsorship is only \$150. These funds go toward seed purchase, on-site garden assistance for the elderly and disabled, equipment, and maintenance of the site.

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Housing Development in Brookfield

around Brookfield this year.

The department recently received notice that it has a green light to begin on home repairs for five homes with the help of the Downtown Revitalization and Economic Assistance for Missouri (DREAM) Initiative.

The DREAM Initiative is an innovative partnership between the Missouri Department of Economic Development, Missouri Development Finance Board and Missouri Housing Development Commission to provide communities across the state with access to technical and financial assistance for downtown revitalization.

Brookfield was named a DREAM community in 2009.

In addition to these home repairs, GHCAA will also be starting construction on one new home in Brookfield with assistance from the Brookfield Building Trades class in association with the Career Center.

GHCAA/GRT Partnership Energizes Missouri

Green Hills Community Action Agency is the recipient of nearly \$300,000 ARRA funds for weatherization of homes in Livingston County. The program, called Energize Missouri, showcases innovative projects throughout the state funded with federal stimulus monies passed through the Missouri Department of National Resources Division of Energy. Energize Missouri is an initiative made possible by funds from the federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Additional weatherization monies have been awarded to the agency through the U.S. Department of Energy DOE and ARRA. The Energize Missouri project is being managed by Terri Henderson, Energy Services Director for Green Hills Community Action Agency.

GHCAA has partnered with Grand River Vocational Technical School to weatherize 40 homes in Chillicothe. The crew, led by Joel Farris, long-time area contractor, and Terri Henderson, also includes two students - Nicholas Koenig and Terrance Smith, as well as Elisha Daniel, Certified Building Performance Institute energy auditor.

The crew has nearly completed 14 homes, with more slated to be weatherized between now and March of 2012.

Homeowners interested in applying for the service may call the Livingston County GHCAA office at 660-646-3379 for an appointment.

During the 20 month program, stu-

dents will learn the skills to become certified energy auditors and weatherization professionals. It is estimated that job growth in the area of weatherization and energy efficiency will grow over 30% in the next decade.

Green Hills Community Action Agency, in its 45th year of operation in northern Missouri, has been a long time weatherization provider under the direction of the Missouri Department of National Resources. Persons who are interested in having a home energy audit, but do not fall within income guidelines, may still receive an audit for a fee. Offender Re-Entry Team Meets in Sullivan County

Recently, Sullivan County began efforts to offer support and solutions to help keep ex-offenders on the path to productivity. The Sullivan County Re-Entry Committee Team met for the first time this past December, with eight founding members in attendance.

The Committee will act as a sort of think-tank, offering insights and resources to participants of the Green Hills Community Action Agency's Offender Empowerment Program.

At each meeting, committee members are presented with a case for review, and a list of barriers to self-sufficiency that particular client faces. The panel then provides ideas for the best way to overcome those barriers.

The Committee is open to new members, and each participant is asked only

for a one hour per month commitment.

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
